CAMERON PUNCHES MAN WHO HELPS CRUSH WOMEN IN JAM

Cries from about 30 women who were screaming for help after they had been jammed by an immense crowd outside the courtroom, where Edward Hugh Martin is on trial for murder, brought District Attorney Cameron to the rescue late afternoon, with the result that the rotund official punched a fellow, much lacking in gallantry, and together with the deputy sheriff succeeded in dispersing a crowd of several hundred people.

A record-breaking crowd jammed around the door of the small court room long before the trial was resumed this afternoon and when the doors were opened at 1:30 as many of the crowd as could quickly filled the court rooms and the remainder jammed about the door with the result that some 30 odd women were crushed and began to scream frantically.

Judge Cameron hastily left his chair at the table and after arguing for a moment with a man who refused to give way to the frantic women, landed a "sleep producer" on the fellow's wind department with the result that others, fearful of the same punishment, quickly dispersed and breathing room was once more to be had.
