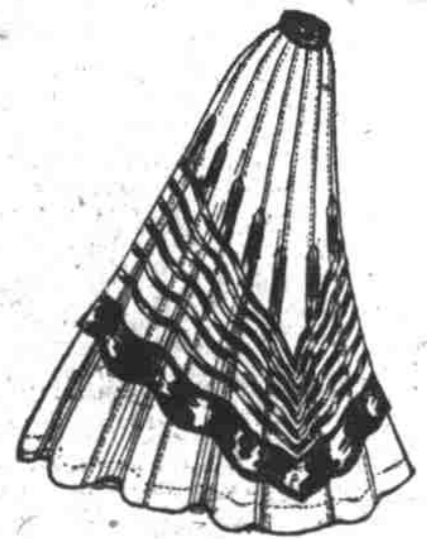

DIRECT PRIMARY IS SUSTAINED

Washington Supreme Court Denies the Five Writs Attacking Law.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Olympia, Wash., Oct. 14.—All the five writs assailing the direct primary law were denied late yesterday afternoon by the supreme court, which upholds the entire direct primary law which had its first test in this state in September. Deepest interest centered in the case

instituted by Charles E. Ooon, who received the most Republican first choice votes for lieutenant-governor, but who failed to receive the required 40 per cent to nominate, and was beaten by M. E. Hay on second choice. The court holds that the legislature had the right to prescribe that where there are four or more candidates for one office it shall require 40 per cent to nominate, and that with such a provision in force it was incumbent upon the legislature to provide some other method of nomination. The court holds that any reasonable method which accomplishes this result must be sustained and that the second choice provision is a reasonable method. It is held that even if the Ooon contention were sustained the result would not be the nomination of Mr. Ooon but the overthrow of the entire law.

The court sustains the validity of the non-partisan judiciary feature, holding that only those candidates nominated by the primary method can have their names printed on the official ballot in the November election. This bars minority parties, such as the Prohibitionists and Socialists from participating in the election of the judiciary except by voting for their own candidates in the general election by stickers or by writing their names on the ballot. The right of nomination by petition to judicial positions is also denied.
Legal Status of Act.
The court refuses an opinion as to whether nominations for representatives by congress are properly a part of a state primary law, as determination of such a question is not necessary to this suit. Similarly, no opinion is given on the senatorial preference, although reference is made thereto. As to fees, the opinion says:
The right to exact a reasonable fee for the privileges of running for office may be sustained on the principle that fees in actions and proceedings in court and for filing and recording papers are sustained.
As to the contention that the act is unconstitutional, because it revises or amends other laws without setting

forth in full such amendments, the court says the act in question is completely within itself and while it necessarily changes existing laws by superseding some and limiting the effect of others, it does not require these old laws should be set forth in full. Such a rule, it is said, would bring legislation to a standstill.
As to the objection requiring a voter at the primaries to call for a party ticket and if challenged to swear he will support that party, it is held this does not require an additional qualification of a voter in excess of those provided by constitution.
The court says the primaries are to select candidates, not to elect officers, and "being so, the qualifications of electors as provided by the constitution for the general election can have no application thereto."
As to the general law, the court says the legislature must provide some process of selection of candidates to go on the general ballot and that the only limitation is that the process adopted must be reasonable. The opinion says: While the method here adopted may deprive some of the minority party of privileges which might properly have been granted them, the court cannot say it is unreasonable.
The opinion says further:
No doubt the qualification was inserted to protect the integrity of political parties. So far from being an unwarranted restriction, it seems to us, if party integrity is to be preserved, this provision is highly proper and commendable, and could have been made with profit much more stringent.
As to the general objection, the law tends to destroy political parties, the court says:
This is a political rather than a judicial question and appeal from the legislative decision must be made to the people rather than to the courts.
