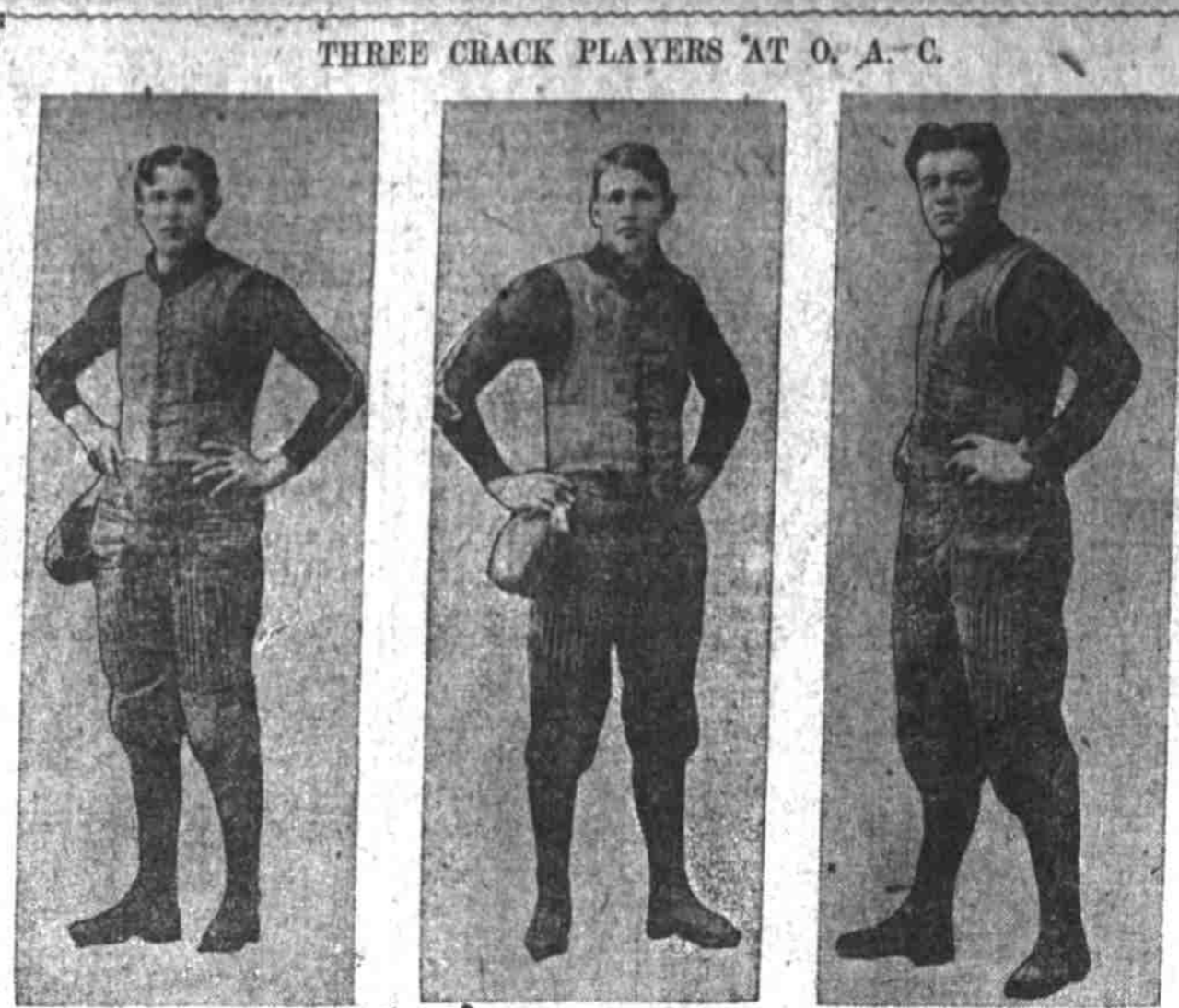
Triangular Athletics Hard on Oregon and Moscow Men—Football Talk.

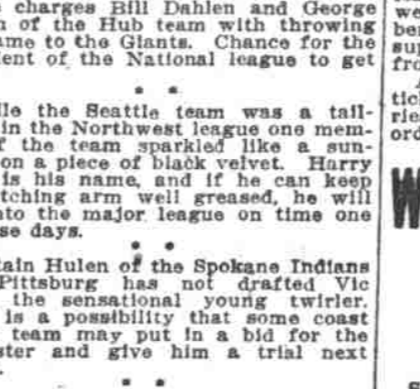

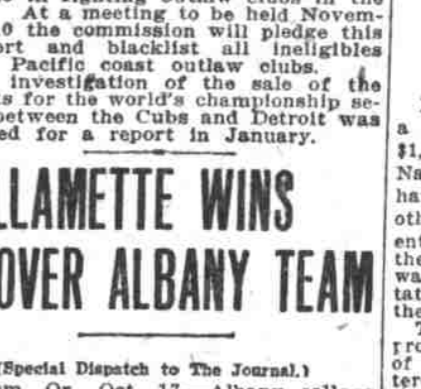

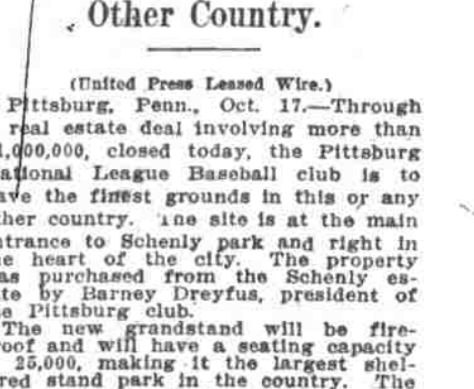
