PLANS RECEIVED FOR EUGENE P. O.

Building Will Be 49x84 Feet, Two Stories; Pressed Brick and Stone.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Eugene, Or., Oct. 20.—Postmaster Page has received from Washington, D. C., the plans for the government postoffice building to be erected here. The bids on the structure are to be opened at Washington November 7 and the contract will be let soon afterward. Several local contractors will figure on the building. The building will be two stories with a full basement. The dimensions will be 49 by 84 feet. The materials will be pressed brick with stone trimmings. The postoffice will occupy the entire lower floor of the building and the forestry department the upper floor. The headquarters of the Umpqua and Tillamook forest reserves is located here, the offices now being in a business block. The government architect estimates the cost of the building at \$65,000. The appropriation is \$70,000, of which \$5,000 was paid for the site and the remainder will be expended for fixtures.

HUGE BAIL BOND FOR A REVOLUTIONIST

(United Press Leased Wire.) St. Petersburg, Oct. 20.—Friends of Nicholas Tschoukowsky, the Russian revolutionist who has been imprisoned in the fortress of St. Peter and St. Paul for 10 months, announce that they have arranged for \$250,000 bail demanded by the government for his release. The government's offer of release on bail came after one of the hardest trials ever made for the liberation of a Russian revolutionist. Tschoukowsky, an American, who had been acquainted with Tschoukowsky during his visit to America, joined in petitions for his release. The prisoner is badly broken in health and will spend the time pending his trial in seclusion for the ordeal.

BIG EXHORTERS NOT FOR OREGON

G. O. P. Spellbinders of National Repute Are Billed for Elsewhere.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Seattle, Wash., Oct. 20.—With the exception of Senator Fulton of Oregon, who will speak in Seattle October 31 while his plane in Oregon is taken by Congressman Will E. Humphrey, there will be no national Republican speakers in Washington during the present campaign. Chairman De Bruler of the state committee had hoped to have Senator La Follette of Wisconsin and Senator Dolliver of Iowa here during the last week, but La Follette's western dates have been cancelled and a telegram received at state headquarters from Senator Joseph M. Dixon, head of the speakers' bureau of the national committee, says: "In order to put Dolliver in doubtful states and save two days in the west, I have cancelled his date in Oregon and Washington and will send him east from San Francisco." Congressmen Cushman and Humphrey will confine their work to the Pacific slope.

SHARP EYES WATCH CASTRO'S BROTHER

(United Press Leased Wire.) New York, Oct. 20.—Major Carmelo Castro, brother of President Castro of Venezuela, says he is in this city on what he calls "a brief visit to America." The major has been given an escort of secret service men for his protection, but it is intimated that the escort is keeping a vigilant eye on his movements in the United States. The major, who has served in the Venezuelan army since he was 15 years old, denies that he is in this country to form an artillery corps for the purpose of manning the coast defense guns of his country's forts should war between Holland and Venezuela begin. After a month in the United States Major Castro will visit France, and will then go to the near east. He intimated that should hostilities begin in the Balkans he would observe the battles with a view to increasing the efficiency of the Venezuelan army.

BRYAN BEATS TAFT TWO TO ONE AT A STRAW ELECTION

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Herrington, Or., Oct. 20.—At a straw election held here Bryan was elected president over Taft by a two to one vote. The election was held in the office of A. C. Crawford, where a representative group of business men were gathered. The result of the straw vote was as follows: Bryan 31, Taft 16, Debs 3, Chaffin 1. This vote is considered by all as a favorable estimate of the way this community will go, though ordinarily Hermitism is strongly Republican.
