With plenty of celery of excellent quality being offered freely by local producers, a car of California stock has been brought to Portland by a local house. Front street merchants in general condemn the practice for several reasons. First, the quality of the local celery is superior to that coming from California. Second, the supplies of local celery are more than sufficient to meet all the custom among some of the Front street dealers to discriminate against Oregon products whenever possible, but the commission on local produce is not as high as that on California produce. Money Should Remain at Home.

It should be the aim of every dealer of produce along Front street to patronize the home producer whenever the latter has supplies to offer. It is willing to accept a reasonable price. We are getting all the local celery we need and there is no use in sending away a large amount of this money to California because we will never get it back. It is not only in celery that some of our merchants discriminate against the Oregon produce. They bring in grapes from the east when we have more at home than we know what to do with. Cabbage is brought from California when the local crop is full of better quality. Grapes are brought from the south when every one knows that the Oregon product was the better of the season. When our market was full of tomatoes, some were brought from California to make matters the worse. It is the doing of this sort of business that are hurting the trade here.
