Lady Harrington (Amy McMillan), who is now in Abyssinia, where her husband, Sir John Harrington, holds an official position, is to come to this country this winter to visit her mother, Mrs. James McMillan, who spends the season in Washington, D. C.

The marriage of Amy McMillan, daughter of the late Senator James McMillan of Detroit, and Lieutenant Colonel Sir John Lane Harrington took place on October 12, 1907, at the home of the bride's mother, "Earlehead," Manchester-by-the-Sea, Rev. Thomas G. Mason, president of Boston college, officiating.

No American girl ever had a more romantic honeymoon trip, it is declared, from that of Lady Harrington.

From the conventional and luxurious life of the North Shore to the tropic jungles and over almost inaccessible mountains is a far cry, but that is exactly what Sir John and Lady Harrington undertook.

The beginning of this wedding tour included a 7,000-mile voyage to Jibuti on the gulf of Aden. From that point a 900-mile journey was taken to the city of Addis Ababa, the capital city of King Menelik, ruler of Abyssinia.

For 185 miles of their journey there is a railroad, but what was left behind it was a matter of horse and camel riding to Addis Ababa. Part of the way was through cultivated fields and valleys, but most of it was through the virgin forests of Ethiopia.

Sir John Harrington is a favorite of King Menelik. One of the first events celebrated after the arrival of the plucky American girl and her titled husband at Addis Ababa, was their reception by King Menelik, and the arrangements for this ceremony were completed long before Sir John left for this country.

The embassy in which they live consists of a series of round houses of various architectural styles, connected one with the other and arranged to form a quadrangle. The luxuries of the North Shore have never been imported to Ethiopia, but the American bride and her titled husband arranged to convert the barbarian home in Abyssinia into an abode of loveliness in which the conventional furnishings of civilization are mingled with the uncouth splendor of barbarism to form a home of beauty such as no American girl of recent years has ever had.

RIVAL AVIATORS GORE-THIRSTY

PIRATES LOOT SECOND TIME STEAMSHIP IN CHILE

German Steamer Serato Boarded by Bandits and Crew Is Attacked With Knives—Vessel Sacked From Stem to Stern.

San Francisco, Oct. 23.—The British steamship Strathford, which arrived here today from Chile, reports a successful raid by Chilean coast pirates on the German steamship Serato in the harbor of Antofagasta on the night of September 28.

The German merchantman was anchored in the harbor loaded to the hatches with a cargo and prepared for sailing on the following morning.

Out of the darkness two dozen pirates leaped on the vessel's decks, and in a twinkling the watch was bound and gagged. The noise of the struggle awoke the captain, who grasped his revolver and rushed on deck. The pirates crept into the shadow as the captain appeared. He was struck from behind with a belaying pin and fell unconscious.

By this time the crew was awakened and as they appeared on deck the pirates attacked them. A pitched battle with knives followed, in which several of the crew were badly injured and the remainder bound and gagged.

The Chileans then sacked the vessel from stem to stern, loading their loot on lighters they had brought with them.

Early next day a Chilean gunboat entered the harbor and the plight of the Serato was discovered. A large party was sent in pursuit of the pirates, who had several hours' start and found safety in the hills.

SNOWSTORM STRIKES CANADA VERY EARLY

Winnipeg, Man., Oct. 23.—One of the worst storms ever known in this section of Canada at this time of the year is raging here today, with transportation is completely demoralized and there is no sign of the storm's diminishing.

The Vancouver express is stalled here and probably will not be able to start west until tomorrow and it is doubtful if it will be able to make much progress then.

No trains arrived here from the east today, and though the railroads are busy with snow plows, they are able to make little headway. Twelve inches of snow has fallen in some places and at many points the drifts are 10 feet deep.

SECOND TIME ACCUSED OF FRAUD

Real Estate Transaction Involving \$1,000 in Vancouver Property Basis of Investigation by Grand Jury.

Whitney L. Boise, once accused of having embezzled funds belonging to the Hawthorne estate and not indicted by the Multnomah county grand jury, is once more, being investigated by the grand jury, this time being accused of the embezzlement of \$1,000 in a real estate transaction in Vancouver.

According to the charges which have been preferred before the grand jury Mr. Boise is accused of having kept for his own use \$1,000, half of the purchase price paid by a man in Washington for three lots belonging individually to Mrs. Rachel Hawthorne and her two daughters, the heirs of the Hawthorne estate.

The transaction is supposed to have taken place in June, 1906. According to a well authenticated report it is charged that in June, 1906, Mrs. Hawthorne and her two daughters decided to sell three lots belonging to

CLAMORS FOR NEGRO'S LIFE

Mob Surrounds Jail at Lithonia and Threatens to Lynch Prisoner.

Atlanta, Ga., Oct. 23.—A mob surrounds the jail at Lithonia today and is threatening to burn at the stake Charles Mitchell, a negro, who killed Deputy Sheriff Argo Peck last Sunday.

The negro was captured after a fierce fight, in which he received 15 severe wounds. He was taken in a small shanty in which he had sought refuge from the officers.

It is believed the negro will recover from his wounds. Lithonia say excitement runs high this afternoon.

THAT UNCONFESSED LIE

When a newspaper stoops to absolute falsehood in order to deceive its readers as to one of the chief issues of a national campaign, when it deliberately misrepresents the utterances of a presidential candidate and of the platform of his party in order to make votes against him, it sinks to the level of the common thief.

By its course in the present campaign the Oregonian has placed itself on a par with the ordinary sneak thief and cheat. Elsewhere in this issue readers will find the proof of this charge.

The San Francisco Examiner once described the Oregonian as a "painted harriidan of journalism." In the face of such deception as the Oregonian is practicing in the present campaign, who will challenge that characterization?

That deception lies in the Oregonian's false statement of the attitude of William J. Bryan and the Democratic party toward tariff revision. In an editorial published September 14 of this year, a little more than five weeks ago, the Oregonian ascribed to Mr. Bryan the weak and meaningless tariff plank adopted by the Republican national convention.

On the day following the publication of this editorial in the Oregonian, the chairman of the local Democratic county central committee wrote to the paper calling attention to the fact that the utterance which it had quoted was not Mr. Bryan's but was the statement of the Republican platform. This letter the Oregonian refused to publish.

Thereupon The Journal published the letter and called upon the Oregonian to acknowledge that its editorial was wrong. There was no response. The Journal has reiterated its demand from time to time within the past five weeks but always with the same result—silence on the part of the Oregonian. For a time The Journal inclined to the supposition that the falsehood might have been the result of crass stupidity or inexcusable ignorance, but in view of the Oregonian's continued refusal to make correction, this theory is no longer tenable.

The Journal now charges not only that the Oregonian lied in its editorial of September 14, but that it is deliberately and knowingly persisting in that lie for the purpose of deceiving voters as to one of the most important issues of the campaign. And we may add that we know of no decent newspaper in the United States that would be guilty of such an act.

In view of the facts, how can any man place reliance upon any statement in the Oregonian's columns, relating to the campaign?

WANTS PANAMA DEAL EXPLAINED

Representative Rainey of Illinois Will Demand Investigation by Congress.

Chicago, Oct. 23.—An investigation by congress of the alleged Panama canal purchase scandal will be demanded by Representative Henry T. Rainey on the opening of congress in December, according to his statement here today.

"The president ought to be in a position to be able to tell whether or not his brother-in-law or the brother of Mr. Taft was interested in an American syndicate which, it is said, succeeded in getting control of the securities of the Panama canal company."

"The president ought to be in a position to know who the members of the American syndicate were. The country is entitled to know all about it, and I intend to see that it is made public."

THAT'S NOT HIS STYLE OF HELL

Los Angeles Pastor Resigns When Flock Insists on Brimstone Type.

Los Angeles, Oct. 23.—Resigning his position as pastor of the Figueroa Street Baptist church rather than preach the doctrine of a literal hell, Rev. Edward H. Brooks today declared that some of the members of his congregation are still living in the "sixteenth century."

Declaring that gossiping women were partly responsible for the unhappy state of affairs in the church, the minister said:

"The trouble is simply this: Three of the deacons belong to the sixteenth century, so far as their religious views are concerned. They have been preaching twentieth century gospel. I want to preach the advantage of a good life, but they wanted me to stick to doctrinal points."

"I do not believe in a literal hell, with fire, brimstone, etc., and I cannot preach it."

JOHNSON WILL NOT SURRENDER

Says Failure of Three-Cent Fare Lines Due to Security Grant.

Cleveland, Ohio, Oct. 23.—Following the defeat in a referendum vote yesterday of the franchise under which the Municipal Traction company is operating its 3-cent fare system, Secretary Davis of the Cleveland Railway company today formally demanded that President Dupont of the Municipal company turn over immediately all the lines in the city to the Cleveland Railway company for operation.

Dupont replied that he could not comply with the demand until ordered to do so by the directors of his company.

The action of Secretary Davis followed a hurried meeting of the directors of the Cleveland company.

Mayor Tom L. Johnson, head of the 3-cent fare scheme, today declared that he favored a new security grant stipulating that seven tickets must be held for 25 cents, and making possible the retention of the 3-cent fare.

"The six for a quarter in the security grant was what defeated us," said Mayor Johnson. "At the time of its operation the Municipal Traction company made a rate of seven for 25 cents in the grant, but we could not get the other side to consent."

"I am sure the people will be glad to grant a new security franchise at a rate of seven for a quarter."

"The election returns will be investigated. I am informed that 2,000 votes cast in precincts where voting machines are used were not counted last night. I expect to demand a recount if I find the result is doubtful."

The result last night showed that the franchise was beaten by 875 votes. The vote was brought about by the action of westerners and contractors, who declared that the Municipal company failed to carry out a contract with them when they were made a party to the franchise.

LATIN-AMERICAN SHARP PRACTICE

Scheme to Make Uncle Sam Defend President Cabrera's Stealings.

San Francisco, Oct. 23.—United States immigration inspectors who have been investigating naturalization frauds in this city are said to have forwarded a report to Washington revealing the fact that Diego Estrada Cabrera, son of the Guatemalan president, is a naturalized citizen of the United States.

The report further reveals that young Cabrera took this step at the instance of his father. It is alleged that the president of Guatemala took this means of safeguarding his property in the southern republic under the American citizenship of his son. After speaking Cabrera because a citizen his father began the transfer of large property holdings both in this country and Guatemala to him. The transfer is said to be in violation of the laws of the United States and is said to be in violation of the laws of Guatemala.
