

WHY A REPUBLICAN LEGISLATURE MUST ELECT A DEMOCRATIC SENATOR

The people in Oregon have initiated and passed, under a provision of their state constitution and legally prescribed forms, a primary elections law, by the terms of which candidates for public office and party organization alike are brought directly under the control of the public will and all public servants made responsible to the people. The law destroys all political machines and political bosses, but not party integrity nor organization.

Their respective parties in the party primaries and the candidate receiving the greatest number of votes thereby becomes the party nominee. Thus, in the general election the party nominees are voted for by the people and the individual receiving the greatest number of votes in the general election thereby becomes the people's choice for United States senator.

Our primary elections law embodying these statements was passed by a popular vote of approximately 56,000 for to 18,000 against, and notwithstanding the great majority in its favor, opponents charged that the people did not know what they were doing when they voted for it. Accordingly, at the last general election, the advocates of the election of senators by the people and of the enforcement of the statement No. 1 submitted to the people the following bill:
