CITIES CAN BAR LIQUOR TRAFFIC

Washington Supreme Court Establishes New Construction of the Statutes.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Olympia, Wash., Oct. 24.—What in effect is almost equivalent to a local option law is already contained in the statutes of this state, under a ruling of the supreme court, in an opinion just handed down. This law, as construed by the supreme court, gives city councils authority to regulate, restrain, license or prohibit the liquor traffic, without having the lower court proceedings subjected to court review.
