Local Merchants' Exchange Leases Rooms for Five Years

MANAGER WRIGHT ANNOUNCES PLANS

Headquarters Will Be Located on Ground Floor at Oak Street Entrance to Board of Trade Building—Service Will Be Increased.

The Merchants' Exchange of this city will next month celebrate its 25th anniversary by moving into new and modern quarters on the ground floor of the Board of Trade building, and by the establishment of a cash grain market in connection with its marine and market report service.

Manager E. W. Wright of the Merchants' Exchange yesterday closed a deal for a five-year lease of the premises west of the Oak-street entrance of the Board of Trade building, and early in November will move the exchange from its present quarters in the Lumber Exchange building.

While the news came somewhat as a surprise, the grain shipping fraternity has for some time been endeavoring to secure a meeting place in keeping with the growing demands of the port.

The California grain trade has reached such great proportions that it requires to handle the services of a large number of vessels, and the interests of the shipping men and the grain men have to certain extent become merged and have thus brought the Merchants' Exchange into more prominence than it has ever before enjoyed.

The Merchants' Exchange was organized in November, 1895, by W. L. Ladd, John McCracken, Wm. Wadhams and a number of others directly and indirectly interested in the grain and shipping business.

While the exchange has supplied the leading grain exporters and others interested in the trade with quotations and statistics, it has made a specialty of handling all the grain, including movements and ocean freights are sought all over the world.

The membership of the exchange includes a number of big firms, which were instrumental in the organization nearly 25 years ago, and there are more than 20 names on the membership lists that have been there for 15 to 20 years.

With the addition of a cash grain department to the exchange, and the steadily increasing number of vessels coming to port, it is expected that the Merchants' Exchange will soon enjoy a prestige equal to that of any other organization of its kind in the country.

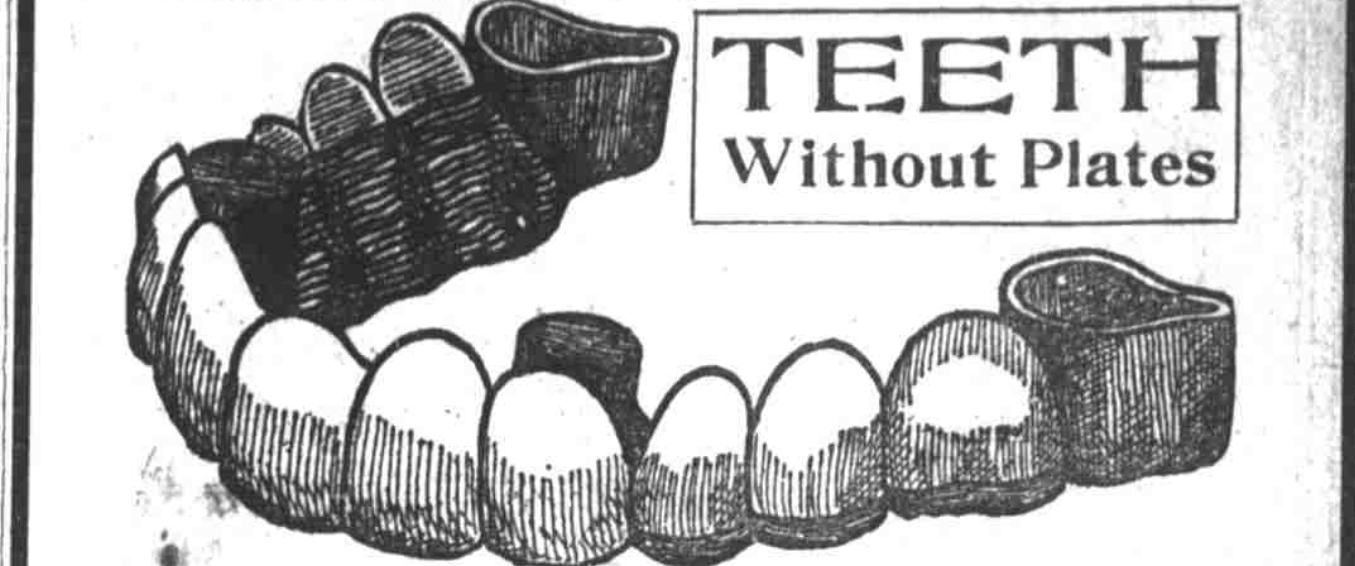
