MUNICIPAL OWNERSHIP

Klamath May Take Over Light and Water Plant.
(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Klamath Falls, Oct. 27.—The Klamath Falls Light & Water company has submitted to the mayor a method of procedure under which it would sell its

light and water systems to the city. The proposal states that the company will sell everything at a price to be determined upon by a competent board of engineers acting as a board of arbitrators, the board to consist of one engineer selected by the city, one by the company and one by these two, if found necessary. The proposal also states that the city must, by vote of the citizens, authorize the issue of bonds sufficient to more than cover the selling price of the light and water systems.

KLAMATH TRAIN SERVICE

Traffic Conditions Greatly Improved Under New Schedule.

Lewis County Institute Opens at Chehalis—Five Days.

Chehalis, Wash., Oct. 27.—The Lewis County Teachers' institute opened here yesterday for a five-day session. There is a large attendance of instructors from different parts of the state and teachers from all over the county. The institute is directed and instructed by Lewis county superintendent, J. B. Mor-

gan, Ellensburg Normal; L. M. Dargy, University of Washington; Frank Deerwester, Bellingham Normal; Frances S. Elys, Bellingham Normal. During the week interesting evening programs will be given in the Christian church.

CHANGE IN OBSERVERS

Roseburg Weather Man Will Come to Portland.
(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Roseburg, Or., Oct. 27.—The local United States weather bureau office will change observers about November 1. Thomas Gibson, who has been in charge of this office for the past 15 years will be transferred to Portland to take a position in the office of E. A. Beales, chief of the bureau for this district. Mr. Gibson will be succeeded by William Bell, who was in charge of this station at the time Thomas Gibson took charge, March 27, 1890. One year before that date, the office was in charge of William Brumfield, who having relieved William Bell, who had been in charge from 1883 to 1889.

PROSPECT FOR COAL

Marion County Men Lease 1,200 Acres Near Silverton.
(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Silverton, Or., Oct. 27.—Believing that the hills south of Silverton contain a rich vein of coal, several farmers have organized a company and will sink a drill within a few days with a view of locating the vein. They have leased 1,200 acres of land adjacent to the city for a term of 20 years. Prospecting is in operation under the supervision of Chief Engineer Berry who recently established the Scott's Mills mine.

VALE'S \$60,000 HOTEL

New Hostelry Is One of the Best Equipped in State.
(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Vale, Or., Oct. 27.—The Hotel Drexel, Vale's new \$60,000 hostelry, opened for business yesterday morning, under the management of F. L. Johnson, formerly of Portland. All of the houses which contain upwards of 50 bedrooms, is

not ready for occupation, but will be fitted up during this week. The hotel was built by the First Bank of Vale, and is constructed of stone and pressed brick. It has been handsomely furnished by Mr. Johnson. It is one of the best equipped hotels in the state.

MINING MEN ACTIVE IN SANTIAM DISTRICT

A. S. Wells, a mining engineer of this city, has returned from the Santiam mining district, which he visited last week, and reports that operations in that section are extremely active. A road is being built from Gates to the camp, which will greatly simplify the problem of getting supplies in.

Six companies are working in the district and development is proceeding at a rapid rate. The Gold Creek Mining & Mill company is to spend \$15,000 on its claim during the coming season and the Portland Smelting company is contemplating the erection of a 100-ton smelter.
