**BRITONS BEHAVE BADLY AT AMOY**

Because Only 60 Invited to Fleet Festivities None Will Attend.

(United Press London Wire.)  
Amoy, China, Oct. 29.—An international complication threatens to mar the visit of the American battleship fleet to Amoy. Invited because only 60 invitations to attend the festivities had been given to British residents here, the British consul-general today refused to attend the victory's reception and the subsequent festivities and it was announced tonight that no British subject would attend any of the festivities.

The American fleet officers are trying to pacify matters, but the extreme fear of the Chinese that some one might be injured through revolutionary outrages during the celebration has led to a curtailment of the number of invitations

even below the number that it was at first announced would be given out. The natives are incensed at what they term an attempt to make the reception exclusive, and there may be trouble before the American ships depart.

An extra guard of police was stationed about the viceroys' palace, tonight to prevent any possible disorder.

**CALIFORNIANS FIGHT OVER INDIAN VILLAGE**

(United Press Los Angeles Wire.)  
Nevada City, Cal., Oct. 28.—Hydraulic paper, native sons of the golden west and the local women's clubs will fight determinedly the effort that is being made by the mining men of this section to oust the Indians from the Campoodie, the Indian village near here. The mining men claim the land upon which the village is located, under the law relating to mineral lands, alleging that it is gold-bearing.

The cause has become so bitter that the state land office and County Clerk Coughlin have been appointed to take testimony in the case November 24.

Meanwhile the opponents of the miners will organize to fight the effort to destroy the Campoodie, which is one of the show places of this region. The Campoodie has been here as long as any white man can remember and the Indians are averse to being moved from their ancient home.

**BUNKOED FARMER SHOTS HIMSELF**

H. E. Lage, From Idaho, Is Induced to Play Races at San Francisco.

San Francisco, Oct. 28.—H. E. Lage, a German farmer from Wenona, Idaho, is lying at the Central hospital from wounds inflicted by himself after he had lost his money to a swindler.

Lage arrived in this city a week ago with \$100 to pay for medical treatment of rheumatism. He fell in with a stranger who persuaded him to bet his money on the races. Losing his all, Lage decided to end his life. He went to Golden Gate park and fired a shot into his mouth and another into his abdomen. The shots were heard by passers-by and Lage was taken to the hospital.

Native Christian Pastor at Tokio Starts Domestic Training School.

Tokio, Oct. 28.—The failure of Japanese living in America to marry American girls has led a Christian pastor here named Shimazaki to start a school where Japanese girls can be prepared for wives of the Japanese in America.

Whether the Japanese in America dislike to make alliances with the women of the white race or whether they are pinning for their own countrywomen, Shimazaki does not say. His school, however, will teach young Japanese maidens the gentle art of cooking the dishes of Nippon and thus save their husbands much gastronomic anguish in the French, Spanish, Italian, German and American restaurants of the coast.
