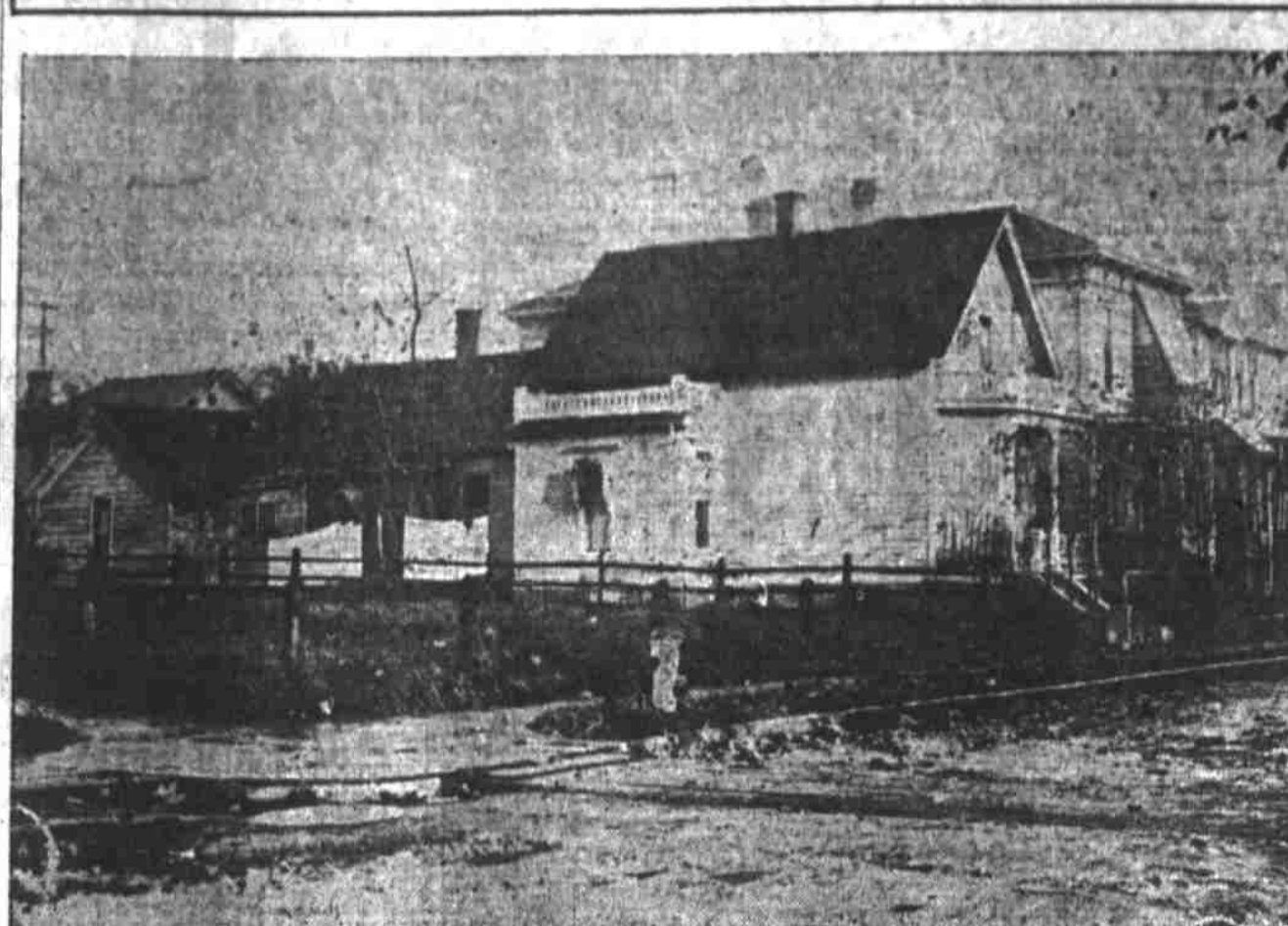


ARLINGTON CLUB MAY BUILD ON THIS BLOCK

The decision was made at yesterday's meeting of the board and the owners of all buildings occupied by Chinese, especially where gambling is known to have existed, will be notified at once. There are several of these along Second street and also in other sections of the city, and for years the police have been unable to get the dens out of the thousands of dollars, but the case for ridding the city of the dens is now being made by discipline, it is thought, but can be extinguished if they are not allowed to place in which to conduct their games of chance.
