

Town Topics

The big minstrel show which the local Spanish war veterans are preparing for the benefit of the sick and relief fund will be a unique and amusing entertainment with a decided local flavor. Some 60 people are rehearsing for the show which includes some of Portland's best talent. A unique feature of the show will be a large singing chorus in which the latest songs will be introduced. The Helig theatre has been secured for two nights. The committee in charge of the minstrel show are Benson Potts, chairman, George McCord, secretary, Ed R. Helig, treasurer. A. J. Salisbury will be in charge of the street parade which will include anything seen here in minstrel parades.

Frank Fuller, a printer, in Burns, Oreg., has been arrested for stealing a letter from the Burns postoffice addressed to William Farre, receiver of the United States land office. A complaint charging Fuller with this offense was filed in the United States court yesterday by Walter H. Evans, assistant United States attorney. The amount of bail has been placed at \$500. This Fuller was unable to give and he is in jail as a consequence. Fuller says he had been drinking and doesn't remember taking the letter.

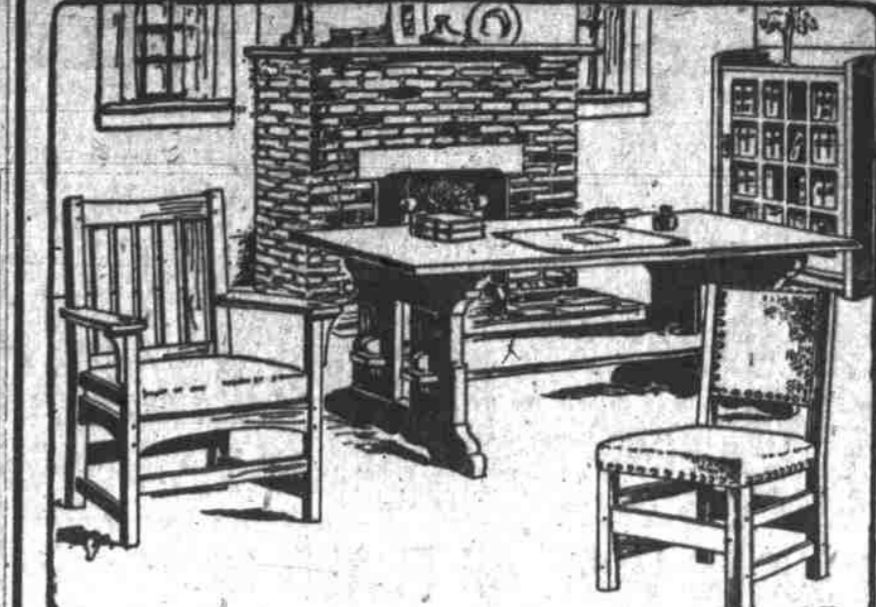

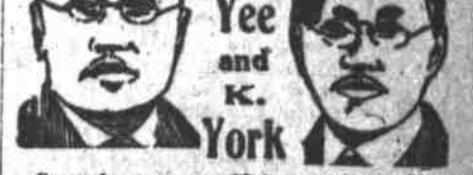
