WASHINGTON MAY JOIN BRYAN STATES

ONLY A MILLION SPENT BY G. O. P.

Chicago, Nov. 2.—The Republicans spent nearly \$1,000,000 and the Democrats spent half a million in the campaign, according to statements given today at the national headquarters here. The Republicans announced that the party leaders in the western division collected \$250,000 and the eastern division contributed the rest. The Republican officials announced that the average contributions were about \$50.

OPPOSE STATE AID FOR SECTARIAN INSTITUTIONS

Ministerial Association of Portland Plans to Make Fight Before Next Legislature—Catholic Refuge Homes and Schools Are to Be Objects of First Attack

The Ministerial association of Portland is preparing to make its existence felt in the next legislature. Catholic institutions that come in for state aid will be the first point of attack. Five or six Catholic institutions now receive state aid aggregating \$22,000 per annum. The appropriation devoted to the non-sectarian institutions of the same kind, including the Patton home, the Baby home, the Florence Crittenton home and others is comparatively small.

JOSEPH LA BARGE THOUGHT TO BE GUILTY OF THREE BURGLARIES

Three cases of burglary have been cleared up by the arrest of Joseph La Barge, a young man living with his aged parents in East Portland. He waived examination in the police court today and was bound over to appear before the grand jury under bonds of \$1,000, not yet furnished.

STRAWS RESULT IN TAFT-STEVENSON CHAIRMAN THOMAS ADVOCATES HALF HOLIDAY FOR LABORERS

Chicago, Nov. 2.—The straw vote conducted by the Chicago Journal was concluded today with the following results: For Taft 3,848; For Bryan 3,629; For Cohan 692; For Hill 372; For Stevenson Democrat 4,425; Deneg. Republican 2,647. The Journal estimates that Adlai E. Stevenson will carry by a margin of 2,000 but that Taft will win the state by a safe plurality.

HILL BANQUET TO COST GUESTS \$6 A PLATE

Six dollars a plate is the price agreed upon by the banquet committee of the chamber of commerce for the banquet Friday night to celebrate the opening of the North Bank road. There is to be no invitation list outside the names of J. J. Hill, Louis W. Hill, Howard Elliott and the important officials of the road. The large dining-room of the Commercial club will host the banquet with about 600 people. Tickets for the banquet are to be sold in the secretary's office of the Chamber of Commerce.

EXCURSION TRAINS FOR FOOTBALL GAME

The Southern Pacific is preparing to handle a crowd of 2,000 people the Saturday before Thanksgiving for the Oregon-Corvallis football game. Excursions will be run to Portland both from Eugene and Corvallis. For the Spokane apple fair which will be held the first week in December the rate of a fare and a third for the round trip from all local points. The Chicago fare will be \$5.50 and from St. Paul and Missouri river points \$8.25.
