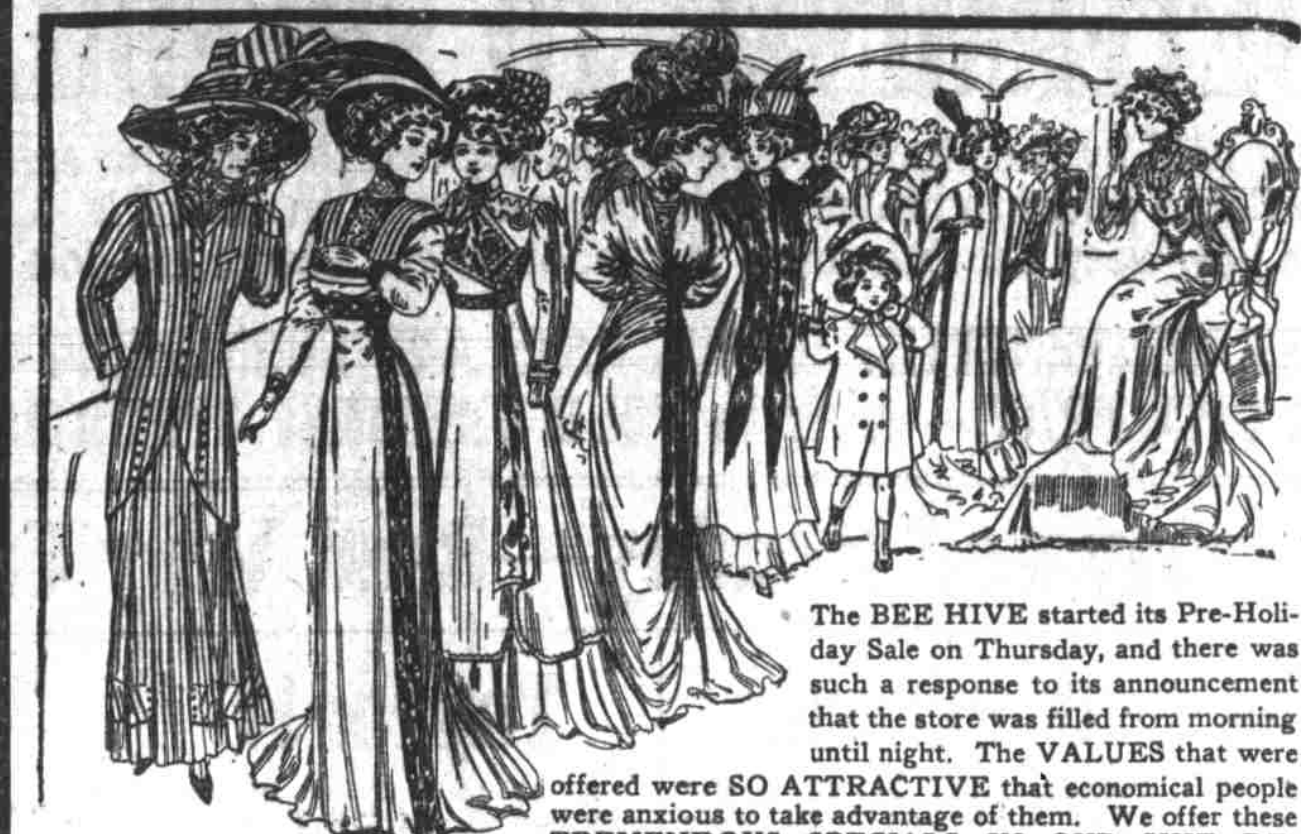
Portland Day at Albany Apple Fair.

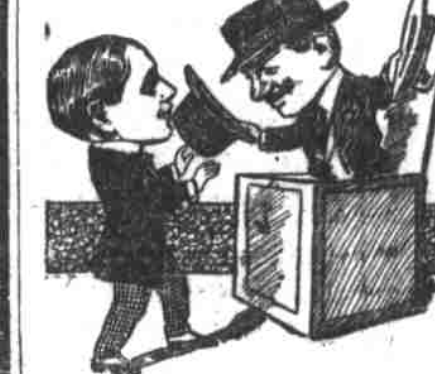
