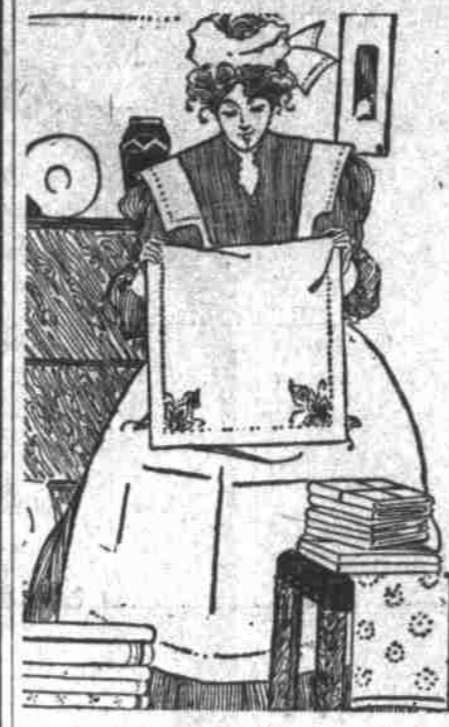

## STEAMER NOME CITY LOSES PASSENGER

E. A. Butler Leaps Overboard a Few Hours Before Craft Reaches Dock From San Francisco—Boat From Nome-City Picks Up Body.

With about 600 tons of eastern freight consigned to local merchants, the American-Hawaiian liner Nebraska, Captain Knight, arrived at Columbia dock No. 1 last night from Salina Cruz via San Diego, after a voyage of 11 days. She is booked to leave tomorrow on the return voyage by way of Seattle.

Officers of the big freighter report having had a pleasant voyage most of the way, the only drawback having been occasional fog. The winds were light and the sea comparatively smooth. A number of steam craft were sighted but the identity of only one could be made out. It was the Harriman liner Rose City bound from this city to San Francisco.

is a voluminous document because of the large consignment and it gives evidence of approach of Christmas.

The steam schooner Nome City, Captain Hansen, which arrived at Couch street dock about 5 o'clock last night, was the scene of a sensation on the way up the river. When passing Rainier a passenger named E. A. Butler leaped over the rail into the river and was drowned. It happened at 3:25 o'clock and every effort was made to save his life.

Chief Officer Fred Theoria says the man must have died almost the moment he struck the water because he remained afloat and was picked up a corpse three or four minutes later. Attempts to resuscitate him were made for half an hour. The body was turned over to the coroner upon reaching the dock.

Butler appeared to be sick and it is believed that he jumped overboard in a fit of insanity. Steward John Brose saw the man climb over the rail and made a rush for him but failed to reach him in time. A boat was immediately lowered and manned by the second mate and three sailors. They had no trouble picking up the man, because he remained floating on the surface of the water, but life was extinct.

A heavy sea broke on him, broke out all the port windows and the boat was swamped. Captain Johns immediately let go both anchors, but as she tightened on her cables they snapped like thread. She was washed on the beach about a quarter of a mile northwest of the five-saving station.

The life-saving crew launched the lifeboat but was compelled to land the boat along the beach abreast the wreck, the tide being so high the trucks could not be used. When almost at their destination a big sea threw the lifeboat against a log, jamming a hole in it, and the next sea capsized it.

Loe Rose was close in by this time and Captain Farley succeeded in getting a heaving line aboard and by this means the crew was taken off.

Had the Tillamook bay station had a motor lifeboat the Rose would never have struck the beach. Neither would she have been wrecked, as the crew could have held her out until the tug arrived. Furthermore, had they had a motor lifeboat the life-saving crew could have towed the Bandon to safe anchorage when she was waterlogged recently.

## BOARD BEING IGNORED

State Pilot Commission Will Seek Recognition of Pilots.

Astoria, Or., Nov. 10.—The state board of pilot commissioners met this afternoon. Chairman Pendleton of Portland and Commissioners Taylor and Farrell present. The board took up the matter of certain pilots operating on the bar without having a license either from Oregon or Washington.

As this is said to be in direct violation of section 1973 of the state code, the commission decided to take official action in the matter but in order to be fair will notify the pilots of their dereliction before referring it to the district attorney.

It appears the licenses held by some of the pilots have expired, and no requests for renewals have been made.

## WILL PROTECT SHIPPING

Work Begins on New Breakwater in Hilo Harbor.

Hilo, Hawaii, Nov. 11.—Work on the new breakwater in Hilo harbor, which will give added protection to ships anchored in the port and will make Hilo one of the best harbors on the Pacific coast, is under way.

Several carloads of boulders have been put in place and 25,000 tons of rock will be brought from the Puna quarries to complete the breakwater. Opposite the point, at Hanaelei gulch, where the breakwater starts, a white flag marks the line the mole will take. This is 7,200 feet away, and it will be several months before the huge cranes reach the spot marked by the flag.
