

WIDOW ADOPTS HER OWN CHILD

Gets Court's Permission to Reassume Little One's Custody.

A mother petitioning the court for permission to adopt her own daughter was the novel situation presented in the county court before Judge Webster this morning. Five years ago, when the mother thought she had only a few months to live, she gave her little girl to one of her close friends. But the mother has outlived the woman who adopted the child, and the little girl has, in fact, been living with her mother almost ever since.

Mrs. Anna E. Hudson, a widow, is the mother of the little girl, having died some time ago. She was living in Utah in 1905 and her health was so poor that her life was despaired of. Thinking she was near death, she consented to the adoption of the child by Mr. and Mrs. James A. Martell. Little Lulu Fern Hudson was then four years of age.

WARRANT OUT FOR MILKMAN

Dairy Commissioner Bailey Charges Sale of the Watered Article.

State Food and Dairy Commissioner Bailey swore out a warrant in justice court this morning charging Ambrose Furrer, a dairyman, with selling adulterated milk. The information sets out that Furrer sold to Paul Maris milk that contained more than 18 per cent of water. The information also alleges that the milk did not contain 10.3 per cent of solids and that it did not contain 9 per cent of solids other than butter fat.

The bureau says that it induces only thrifty landseekers to come under its care, and guarantees that they are such people as would be desirable residents. The company merely leases the land from the original owners and sells it to the homeseekers at a price agreed upon between the members of the company and the bishop of the diocese.
