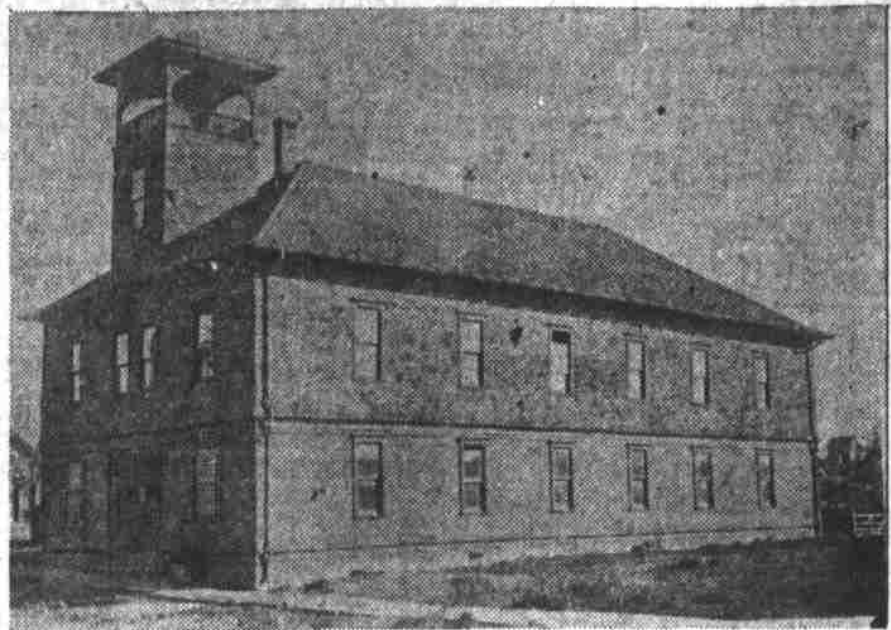

Judge Morrow granted a temporary injunction restraining acts of violence or the use of invectives. Negotiations for a compromise, which were continued for some time, have at last definitely failed.

Judge Gantenbein will also rule on a demurrer in the case of Edith Miller against the city of Portland.
