Journal Letter From Windy City Tells of Important Things Happening in the Middle West—Results of Business Revival.

Chicago, Nov. 18.—State or federal regulation of timber cutting on lands in private ownership is a new departure in the way of government regulation which may be effected this winter, say lumbermen in this city, as a result of the disastrous forest fires which have made this season historic in the annals of the lumber industry.

The first results of the big business revival have already begun to make themselves felt in the money market. For money, declare Chicago bankers, "at present the volume of free money in the banks is at a high tide."

Over \$7,000,000 of Chicago's income this year will come from saloons, which makes the item of tax look sick—only \$12,000. The increased cost of licenses from \$500 a year to \$1,000 drive about 1,000 third emporiums out of business, but made an enormous increase in the city's revenues.
