UNUSUAL HONORS TO CHINESE ENVOYS

(United Press Leased Wire.)
San Francisco, Nov. 20.—Final preparations for the reception of the Chinese envoys, Prince Tsai Fu and Mandarin Tong Shao Yi, who are on their way to thank the United States government for remitting the Boxer indemnity, have been made by the local Chinese colony. The princes are expected Monday morning on the Pacific Mail steamer Mongolia. The revenue tug Golden Gate and Hartley and the United States army tug General Slocum will go out beyond the heads to meet the envoys.

GERMAN COLONISTS FOR KERN COUNTY

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Bakersfield, Cal., Nov. 20.—The colonization of thousands of acres of Kern county land is predicted following the announcement that a German syndicate has paid \$1,000,000 in cash as a deposit on a purchase of territory for which the total price will be \$10,000,000 when the deal is completed. Plans are under way for the exploitation of the property, and when the tracts are opened the syndicate will establish agencies in all principal cities of the world to encourage immigration to Kern county. It is believed there is to be a general reorganization of the Miller & Lux corporation and that the German capitalists have acquired directing control through inheritance of the shares of the late Charles Lux, the partner of Henry Miller, the cattle king.
