Secret of Washing Gloves. From the New Orleans Times-Democrat "The only trouble about these wash gloves," said the lady, "is that they dry, after washing, so very stiff and boardlike."

"That is easily remedied," he said, "if you know how to wash the gloves so that they will dry soft and pliable, the same as new. After you have rinsed them quite clean, dip them in a bucket of fresh water and rub plenty of soap into them, drying them without rinsing this last soap. The soap left in the gloves makes them wonderfully soft—they don't then dry stiff, drying to be rubbed soft with 10 or 15 minutes' hard labor. This soap secret being used, wash gloves are quite perfect. It is no wonder they are completely superseding the expensive kid gloves for they are half as cheap again and their washing is so easy—just at bedtime, toss them on the radiator, and in the morning they are ready to put on."
