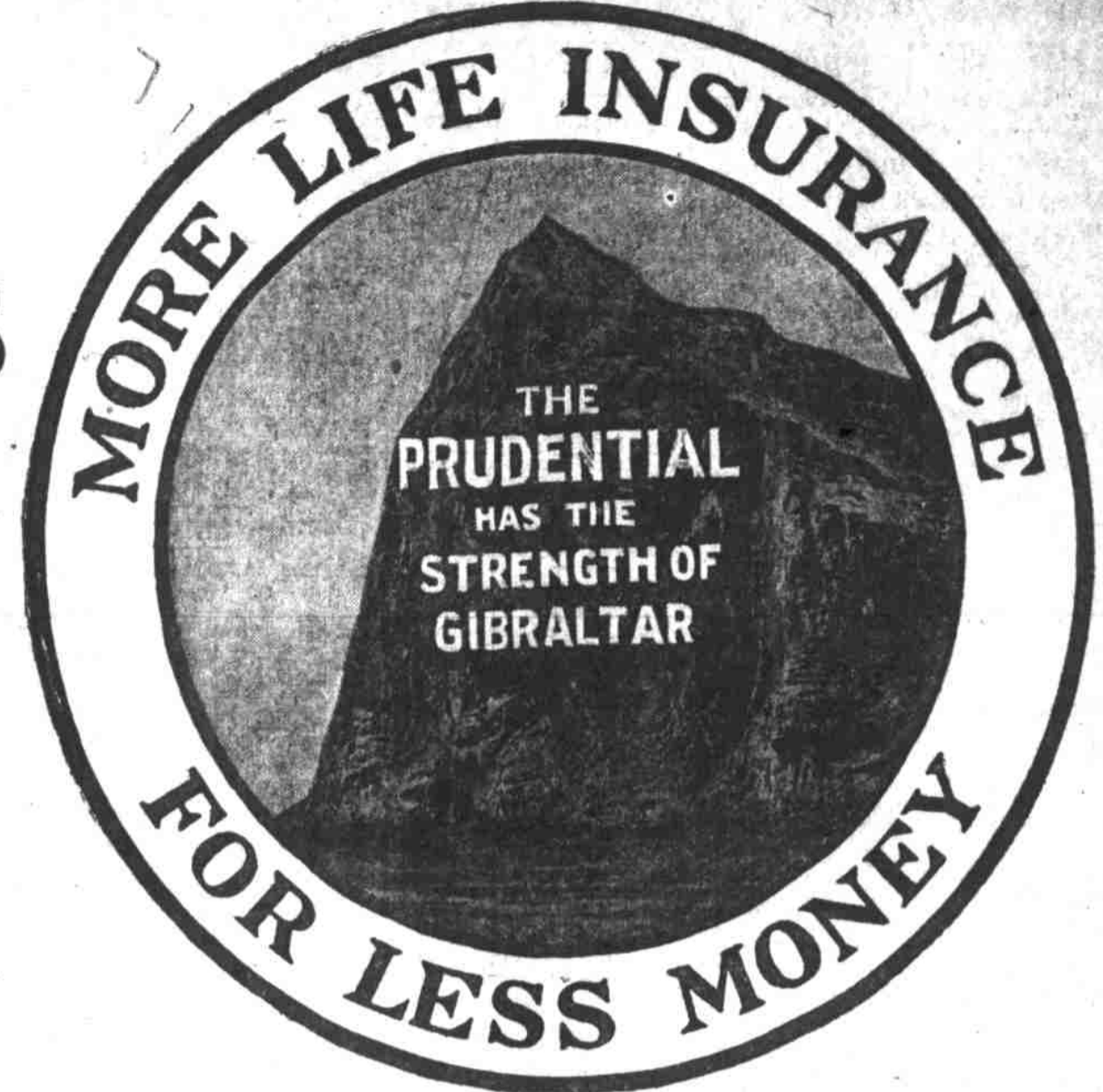

William Slusher Declares Department Seeks to Injure Sheepmen.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal) Pendleton, Or., Nov. 23.—Another cut in the number of sheep allowed upon the Wenaha forest reserve for grazing during the season of 1909 has just been announced by J. M. Schmitz, supervisor. The reduction amounts to about 8 per cent of the number grazed last year.
