WANT TO SWIFT PACKING PLANT WILL BE 10 CENTS

General Manager Fuller Intimates at Council Meeting That Extra Nickel Will Be Collected Between Terminus of Proposed New Line and City Limits.

The fact that the Portland Railway, Light & Power company intends to charge an extra fare from the city limits to the Swift packing plant was reported from F. J. Fuller, general manager of the company, this morning when he was asked point blank by Councilman Kellaher if it was the intention of the company to make a fare of no more than 5 cents.

Mr. Kellaher then introduced an amendment to section 12 of the ordinance which provides that the company may collect no more than 5 cents for a single fare in any one direction within the city limits by adding the words, "the council shall reserve the right to regulate fares at all times."

Another section, which gave the company the right to charge such rates as it pleased for observation funerals and other special cars, was referred to the city attorney for investigation.
