James Sanford's Large Stock Farm Is Sold.

He is a retired capitalist and now resides in Eugene.

FRANCHISE BILL SAFEGUARDING, CITY TURNED DOWN BY COUNCIL

The city council is considering today a franchise ordinance drafted by the railway for the Portland Railway, Light & Power company, which is asking the city to grant it extensions on more than 40 streets. This measure furnished by the corporation asking the franchise is given precedence over City Attorney Kavanaugh's ordinance for the same purpose, drafted by careful and painstaking effort on the part of the city attorney to safeguard the city's interests by the insertion of a number of restrictive clauses. And this after the franchise committee had previously directed the city attorney to draw up the ordinance.

HEAP O' PENNIES ONE MILE LONG TO BUILD PARK

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) La Grande, Or., Nov. 24.—One hundred children are requested by the Riverside Park association to open a campaign for a heap of pennies just one mile long. The first move in this splendid movement in which the children under 15 years of age can help to build the park, will be started this week. It will be spread out to include every child in La Grande before it ends. The initial step will be for 100 children to make 10 little bags each and have them at the W. H. Bohnenkamp store by next Saturday evening. The dimensions called for are 3x4 inches, with a stout draw cord at the top. The color and material is not specified. If 100 children will spend their little Thanksgiving vacation in this way, and later devote themselves to saving enough pennies to reach one mile when laid side by side, they will have done wonders toward the securing of the new park that they may enjoy when grown to man and womanhood.

HANFORD HIT HARD BY REFORM WAVE

(United Press Leased Wire.) Hanford, Cal., Nov. 24.—The reform wave, which has deluged the south and east today reached Hanford. The first indications of the long south tide scheduled to visit this city were noted last night, when the board of trustees voted to place radical restrictions on the saloons of the city. The city attorney was instructed to draw ordinances closing the saloons of the city at 12 o'clock at night and keeping them shut until 5 o'clock in the morning and closing the saloons on Saturday at midnight and ordering them not to open again until Monday morning. A 25 per cent increase in the cost of saloon licenses is another order promulgated last night, to go into effect after March 1909.
