

TWO WAREHOUSE CARBOESCENED Steamer Arabia Leaves for Japan and China With Flour.

FRENCH SHIP GOES TO EUROPEAN PORTS Manifest of the Marechal de Nollais Shows Vessel Will Carry 100,000 Worth of Wheat to Europe—Oriental Cargo Worth \$200,000.

With the clearing through the customs house today of the German steamer Arabia of the Portland & Asiatic line, for Hongkong and way points, and the French ship Marechal de Nollais for Queenstown or Falmouth for orders, over \$300,000 worth of home products were set afloat for foreign markets.
