DEATH KNELL OF RACING SOUND

Trouble Ahead for Meadows Sends Fear to Hearts of Horsemen.

San Francisco, Nov. 30.—With ominous rumors of dire "trouble ahead" for the Meadows race course at Seattle, racing interests in California today are confronted with the apparently well-founded prediction that "the sport of kings" is doomed in this state.

Following the anti-race track legislation in New York, the agitation in California has been so intense that the passage of an anti-race track bill in Washington would mean practically the death of racing in the United States.

San Francisco, Nov. 30.—Cornelius Connolly, a concrete worker, 34 years of age, and a runner of established local reputation, distanced 24 runners yesterday in a Marathon race of nearly 21 miles between Beaverton, Hayward and Castroville valley.

He made a record of 1:51:25, beating the amateur record hitherto established for the distance.

Connolly kept ahead of his rivals throughout the contest and in a long undisturbed stride left all of them far behind, finishing 10 minutes in front of the next man, a soldier, Joseph B. King.
