WEATHER REPORT

An extensive high pressure area, the crest of which overlies southeastern Montana and North Dakota, where the barometer reading is 30.70 inches, dominates the weather conditions from the Pacific to the Mississippi. The low pressure area that was over Minnesota Monday morning has moved rapidly eastward with diminished energy. The weather continues clear and calm over the entire Pacific coast and New England this morning. Light rain has fallen in the middle Atlantic states, eastern Tennessee and Alabama, and snow has occurred in scattered sections of the upper lake region, the upper Mississippi valley, Montana, Wyoming, Colorado, and Utah. In the latter states being experienced this morning in the British northwest, Montana, the Dakota, and Minnesota. The temperature has occurred in all sections between the Rocky mountains and the Mississippi river. The weather remains unseasonably warm over the Atlantic and east gulf states. Light frosts occurred this morning in southern California and killing frosts in southern Arizona.

The indications are for fair weather in this district on Wednesday and it will be warmer in eastern Washington and Northern Idaho.
