M'ARTHUR IS NOT WILLING TO REPLY

(Continued From Page One.)
tem repudiated by the people through the enactment of the primary law.
Issue Clearly Defined.
This issue has become clear cut and definite and has been extended through agitation into the fight for the organization of the house and senate. The members of the legislature have recognized this to be a fact and because it is, are lining up for a Statement No. 1 or an anti-Statement No. 1 organization. It being the contention of the Statement No. 1 men that they are forced, for self protection, to accept the challenge of the anti-Statement No. 1 agitators and enter into the contest on the lines drawn by those who are seeking to override the will of the people.
Mr. McArthur in making his campaign for the speakership contends that he is simply seeking the nomination for the office at the hands of a Republican caucus and election as a result of that caucus. His candidacy, however, is being fostered and backed

by those who are the leaders in the campaign to induce legislators to violate their pledges, break their promises and defeat the will of the people as expressed at the polls.
Because of this conflicting situation and in order that Mr. McArthur might have an opportunity to state his position clearly to the people as regards his belief that pledges should be kept or broken. The Journal on November 13 addressed the following letter to him:
"Dear Sir—In view of the fact that you are a candidate for speaker of the house of representatives in the Oregon legislature and the further fact that if elected speaker you will be in a position to exert a considerable influence upon the election of United States senator, the Journal desires to ask you the following questions:
"First—Do you consider it the duty of each legislator who subscribed to Statement No. 1 to abide by that pledge?
"Second—Do you think it the duty of all members of the legislature to obey the instruction given by the people of Oregon in the election of June, 1908, when they directed the legislature to elect as senator that man who received the highest popular vote in the preceding election?
"Third—In view of the fact that you pledged yourself before your nomination and election to vote for the 'Republican voters' choice' for United States senator, is it your purpose to vote only for H. M. Calk for that office?
Mr. McArthur was at the time engaged with the advertising and other details of the management of the University of Oregon-Corvallis football game, and this, together with business affairs, delayed his answer. On November 28 he replied, declining to answer the questions put to him by the Journal, and thus refusing to state whether

he believed that men who had pledged themselves to Statement No. 1 should abide by that pledge or break it, whether he considered it the duty of members of the legislature to be bound by the voted instructions of the people, or whether he intended to keep the pledge of 'Republican voters' choice' made by him and cast his ballot for H. M. Calk for senator. His letter follows:
"Owing to rush of business I have been unable to give your letter of the 13th instant anything like the consideration to which it is entitled until today.
"At the present time I respectfully decline to answer the questions which you ask me, for the reason that it appears to me I am being singled out from among the large number of candidates as one upon whom the Bourne-Chamberlain crowd wish to make an attack. As you know, I am a candidate for speaker of the house, and probably have more votes at my command than any other candidate at the present time. A very bitter fight is being made against me by the Bourne-Chamberlain combination.

I do not propose at this time to make any statement that will in any way embarrass my candidacy, although I have in my mind answers for all three of the questions which you have seen fit to ask.
"If you address a copy of the letter which you mailed to me to each of the candidates for speaker of the house and if all of them send answers, I shall do so. I am not afraid to make a public statement as to my views on any question, but I do not propose to be made the victim of circumstances. For this reason, as much as I would like to accommodate you, I must decline to do so.
"Thanking The Journal for many past favors, I beg to remain, very sincerely yours,
