

NOMINATIONS TO THE SENATE

Recess Appointments Include Cabinet Officers—Postmasters.

(Special Press Telegram.) Washington, Dec. 8.—President Roosevelt today sent to the senate the following nominations for confirmation: Luke Wright, secretary of war; Truman H. Newberry, secretary of the navy; Herbert L. Satterlee, assistant secretary of the navy; Daniel J. Keefe, commissioner general of immigration; Rufus H. Thayer, judge of the United States district court of China; Wade Ellis, assistant attorney general.

The president also sent to the senate several hundred nominations of postmasters and other officials who have been appointed during the congressional recess and whose names have already been announced.

Among the postmasters named today besides John C. Young of Portland, Or., are the following: L. B. Rutherford, Rainier; J. E. Logan, Burns; Ben Weather, Enterprise; George F. Russell, Seattle.

HARRIS'S SHORTAGE TOLD TO COUNCIL

Committee Reports Deficit of \$176—No Prosecution Probable.

(Special Dispatch to the Journal.) Vancouver, Wash., Dec. 8.—At the meeting of the city council last evening the council committee appointed to look into the condition of the books of City Clerk Harris, made its report, which was accepted by the committee.

This report shows that Harris is short in his accounts to the extent of \$176. The majority of the shortage is in the city cemetery and city license matters. The examination, according to the report, brought to light a most startling condition of the city books. There were numerous omissions and changes, it was alleged, and in several instances under a license holder's receipts had been torn out. The Merchants' Express company has been doing business under a license issued for several months, but there was no trace of the \$10 fee having been turned in to the city treasury. On the other hand, several such cases were reported, in all about \$45; the cemetery shortage amounted to about \$70.

The council decided to instruct the city attorney to call on Harris for the payment of the shortage and in case he does not reimburse the city, the council will be dropping following a belief of some of the councilmen that the case is entirely one of carelessness.

Professor Hough, the council committee said this morning that it was an exceedingly hard matter to determine just what the shortage really was. "There has been no ordinance written up since," said Professor Hough, "and the books are all in a most confused state, showing great carelessness."

WEATHER REPORT

Storm warnings were ordered displayed at 4 p. m. for a disturbance which is now central near Vancouver Island. The following are the conditions reported last night: North Head, Wash., 56 miles southeast; Tatoosh Island, Wash., 48 miles east. This storm has caused moderately heavy rains in the Willamette valley and western Washington and light rains in the northern Oregon, Washington and northern Idaho. A second disturbance is central northeast of Montana, and a high pressure area overlies the southern states from the Rocky mountains east to the Atlantic ocean. Light snow has fallen at scattered places in the northern states from Minnesota east to New England and as far south as Virginia. It is warmer in the north Pacific states and generally in the southern states east of the Mississippi river.
