

## WELCOME TO BISHOP SMITH

Methodists Greet New Leader—Mayor Lane Among the Speakers.

Members of the Methodist church and citizens of Portland paid their welcome to Rev. Charles W. Smith, who accompanied by his wife, reached the city Monday night to take his place as bishop of Oregon for the Methodist church.

A pleasant reception and banquet was tendered the bishop by the Men's Methodist Social Union and the Methodist Ministerial association.

The bishop and his wife were seated in the auditorium of the church at 7:30. At the conclusion of the reception the banquet was served in the parlors of the church down stairs by the Ladies' Aid society of Grace church.

A. F. Fiegel served as toastmaster and introduced the speakers. Because of having to leave for an executive meeting, Mayor Lane

welcomed the bishop before the banquet had begun. He spoke in a happy vein for a short time, declaring that Portland was one of the cities in the country where the people love and obey the law in spite of the little diversion at the East Side bank.

Rev. C. E. Cline welcomed the bishop in behalf of the Methodist Ministerial union. E. B. Piper spoke in behalf of the press. Mr. Fiegel spoke for the social union of the Methodist church. In the absence of Rev. H. H. Marvin of Seattle, Rev. B. F. Brooks of Vancouver spoke for the Methodist church of Washington. Dr. Luther R. Dyott welcomed the bishop in the name of the Portland Ministerial association.

Bishop Smith replied briefly to the various welcoming addresses. He said that he rejoiced in the fraternal feeling shown, and that during his labor here he would wish for the cooperation of all and the loyal support of not only his church members but of all those interested in the cause of Christianity and of civic righteousness.

While the banquet was in progress delightful music was rendered by a harp and mandolin quartet. Miss Alice Juston sang "On the Shore" by Neidlinger, and responded to an encore with "Just Her Way" by George Aitken. George H. Street sang the "Bodouin Love Song" by Chadwick.

## PAY-AS-ENTER CARS ARE READY

New Style Streetcars in Operation on Three Lines Tomorrow.

Twelve of the new "pay-as-you-enter" streetcars will go into service on the Twenty-third street and the Hawthorne avenue carlines tomorrow morning. Twelve cars will be put on the Twenty-third street line and four on the east side branch.

This announcement was made by F. L. Fuller, vice president and general manager of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company this morning. Eight of the new style cars now being equipped with collection boxes and motors are to be put on the Wilamette Heights line some time during the month. These cars start from the depot.

The following instructions for the benefit of patrons of the pay-as-you-enter cars have been issued by the company:

"If passengers have not the exact fare, conductors will furnish change, returning the full amount to the passenger, who will then deposit the exact fare in the box."

"Passengers desiring transfers must obtain them from the conductor at the time fare is paid."

"Electric signal push buttons are located on the posts between windows; press button as a signal for car to stop."
