DESPOTISM IN A DEMOCRACY

Walter Thomas Mills Says Corporations Russianizing American Industries.

In his lecture on "Either Despotism or Democracy. Both in the Workshop and at the Ballot Box," at the Masonic temple last evening, Walter Thomas Mills said:

"Despotism always rules by appointment from the top down. Democracy ruled by election from the bottom up. Under a despotism every officer is a master. Under a Democracy every officer is a servant."

"In this country we have two governments, one a democracy, with its headquarters in Washington, the other a despotism with its headquarters in New York. In this country we have an industrial despotism existing in the midst of a political democracy."

"Whatever form of government is to be established and maintained either in industry or in politics must prevail in both."

"It is admitted that self-government in the industries is greatly to be desired and would be ideal were it possible, but then it is contended that any effort to establish industrial self-government, instead of realizing a beautiful ideal would result in doing infinite harm instead."

"If industrial democracy is to harm society it must do so either by lowering the grade and the character of the workers, or by producing a smaller or an inferior product, or by corrupting the government. If society is injured in none of these industries, then the last objection to self-government in the workshop as well as at the ballot box is overthrown."

"The modern corporations have already Russianized American industry. Just now there is an effort to Russianize American politics. To use the public authority of this country as a bloodhound on the footsteps of the Russian reformers."

"The yield democracy everywhere is to lose it ultimately everywhere. It can not exist in the workshop and very long be kept from the ballot box. If it is to survive at the ballot boxes it must be extended to the workshop, or, in the words of Lincoln, 'we shall continue our assault until all of liberty is lost.'"

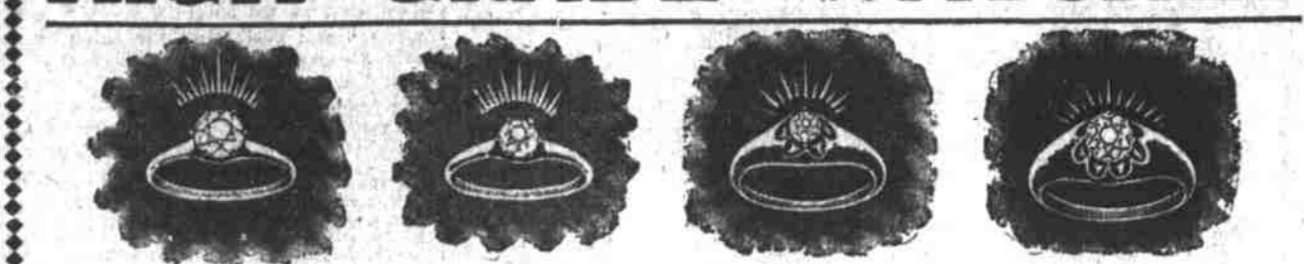

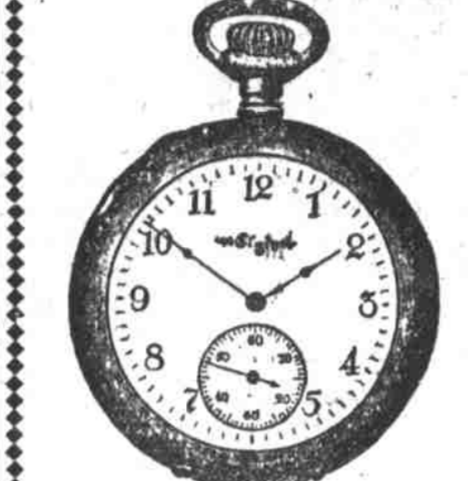

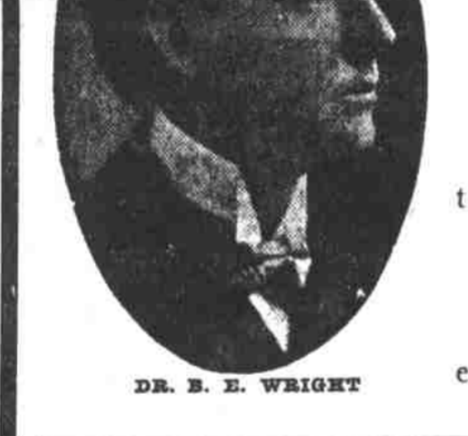
