

DEATH FROM POISONED OYSTERS

Of Party of Three, Two Are Dead and One Has Typhoid Fever—Others Suffer From Eating Infected Bivalves.

(Near News by Longest Leased Wire.)  
New York, Dec. 12.—Of a merry party of three who had an oyster luncheon in the stag room of a fashionable uptown hotel, the day after election, two are dead and one is still ill from typhoid fever.

Of another party of three who lunched in the same place the same day, also partaking of oysters, all are suffering from typhoid fever and the physicians who have been in charge of the cases believe the men have been affected by the bivalves they ate.

The latest death in the first party was that of Friday night of J. B. Rowland of the Rowland Advertising company of this city. The other one of the party who died was A. B. Elliott of the Witherbee Lumber company. The third member, now convalescent in Toledo, Ohio, is Herbert Lytle, the automobile driver.

The members of the second party were Thomas Watson, the agent of the Lyle Gear company; Otto Hein, of the Bosch Magneto company, and L. A. Hopkins, former manager of the American company. These three have been suffering from typhoid fever, but are now improving.

With the exception of Mr. Rowland and Mr. Elliott, those stricken were automobile men. A coterie of these, including the two named, termed themselves the Fiat Tire club, and they had a certain table in the stag room where they dropped in for lunch. It was at this table that the three among whom the deaths occurred sat.

All three partook of the oysters on the day following election. A week later to a day they came down with typhoid fever. Mr. Elliott had the most serious case and, without rallying, he sank rapidly and died two weeks ago. Two weeks ago Mr. Rowland began to rally, but pneumonia set in and he died Friday night at 10 o'clock.

Mr. Rowland's physician said tonight he had found it impossible to trace the infection to any other source than the oysters.

Mr. Rowland had been in the advertising business in New York about five years. He had been married about eight years and left a widow. He was 31 years of age.

Shortly after Mr. Rowland and his friends had become victims of the fever, a western automobile man came to New York. As usual with western men, his first thought was for some good oysters.

The story goes that he went to a hotel and ate a couple of oysters. The same afternoon he heard about the condition of the automobile men who had eaten oysters, and he became so frightened that he and a couple of days friends guarded him, fearing that he might do harm to himself.
