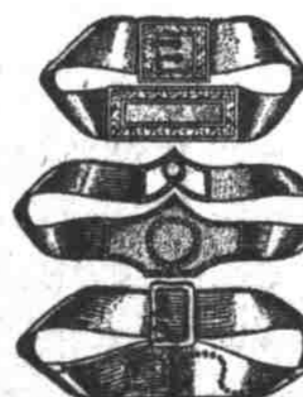

CLUB DISCUSSES GARBAGE BURNER

East Side Business Men Will Recommend Plan to the City.

The two committees appointed at the last meeting of the East Side Business Men's club recently met last night and discussed the advisability of erecting a garbage crematory on an island down the river; also plans for new water mains. Both subjects are of great importance to east side residents. Just now.

Dr. M. G. McCorkle over the garbage crematory committee. It is the desire of the latter body, and the residents of East Portland generally, that a city crematory be located near the mouth of the Willamette river, far enough down that the north winds will not make it offensive to the city. Barges covered with galvanized iron would be used to carry the waste down the river and the city would collect the garbage three times a week at a cost of about 25 cents a month to householders. Resolutions to this effect were adopted and will be presented to the east side club for endorsement and then referred to the city council. Joseph Supple estimates that 20 barges for crematory use could be purchased for \$50,000 and perhaps less. Councilman Kel-laber announced that after conferring with people in other parts of the city, he had learned that the east side plan would be heartily endorsed. The water committee decided to recommend that the laying of all mains under 10 inches be paid for out of the income from water rates and that mains 10 inches and over be laid at the expense of the general fund. It was determined not to ask for the proposed reduction in water rates until after the city had been laid.

CORNERSTONE OF THEATRE LAID

Project Backed by Number of Millionaires—Speech by Mayor McClellan of N. Y.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) New York, Dec. 15.—The cornerstone for the New theatre, the first playhouse ever erected in America for other than commercial purposes, was laid today with interesting ceremonies. The occasion was made notable by addresses by Mayor McClellan and others of prominence. The musical portions of the program were furnished by the forces

of the Metropolitan opera. The event attracted a large crowd of spectators to the corner of sixty-second street and Central Park west, where the playhouse is being erected. The new theatre is designed to be a model playhouse, to be operated on a plan akin to the subsidy system of Europe for the advancement of the art of acting and of the proper presentation of the best plays. The project is backed by half a hundred of the nation's leading millionaires. They will receive no profit beyond a low rental on the \$2,000,000 advanced for the construction and equipment of the theatre. The aim is to make of the New theatre as nearly as possible a national theatre. One of its prime objects is the encouragement of American playwrights and American actors and actresses. Intrinsic merit, however, will be the first essential and if the American product in particular cases fails to come up to the standard of excellence required it will be rejected in favor of European plays or players. The theatre will occupy a full block between Sixty-second and Sixty-third streets, opposite the west side of Central Park. It will be a very handsome structure of the French renaissance style of architecture and built of gray sandstone. The auditorium will seat 2318 persons, 600 of whom will be placed in the orchestra. The boxes will be in two tiers, two boxes being reserved for the directors and the artists. The stage itself will be the finest in the world and will be equipped with every appliance known to modern builders. The 49 dressing rooms will be reached by elevators. Every provision will be made for the comfort and safety of the patrons. The exits will be so arranged that the house can be emptied in about two minutes, and automatic sprinklers over the stage and in the dressing rooms will practically make a serious fire impossible. The boxes will be low and there will be no seats under the balcony on the first floor. The interior decorations of the house will be elaborate.

ARCHITECTS ENTER A CRUSADE FOR ART

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Washington, Dec. 15.—Several hundred of the leading architects of America, members of the American Institute of Architects, met today, the occasion being the annual convention of the organization. The sessions will last through Thursday, with President Charles Gilbert presiding. The special topic chosen for consideration at the meeting this year is "The Relation of the National Government to Art." Addresses will be delivered by Secretary of the Interior James R. Garfield, President Nicholas Murray Butler of Columbia university, Senator Francis Newlands of Nevada, Commissioner of Indian Affairs Francis B. Leupp, and Henry M. Fritchett, president of the Carnegie Educational Trust. Each of the speakers is expected to take a different branch of the subject and discuss it from his own point of view. After the discussion the institute probably will formulate a resolution to be presented to Congress asking that steps be taken
