

### THREE ADVANCED TO PRIESTHOOD

Oregon has three new priests in the ministry of the Episcopal church. Rev. Samuel M. Dorrance of Trinity church, Ashland, Rev. Frederick B. Bartlett of St. Luke's church, Grants Pass, and Rev. Edgar Huntington of All Saints church, Portland.

The ceremonies by which the three candidates were advanced to the priesthood were held in the pro-cathedral yesterday morning, being conducted by Bishop Scadding. Rev. Horace Ramsey, rector of the pro-cathedral, delivered the sermon. He spoke of the duty of those who became priests of the church, and how necessary the priesthood was in the work of the church and pointed out the esteem in which the priesthood should be held by the people at large.

The candidates were presented by Rev. George B. Van Waters. The three men were brought to Oregon by Bishop Scadding from the east a year ago to aid him in the plan, which he has mapped out for the extension of the work of the Episcopal church throughout the state.

Rev. Remington is from Rochester, N. Y. He studied for three years in the Episcopal theological school at Cambridge, Mass. While attending that school he did a great deal of work at a mission church at Farmington, and became a deacon last June at Middletown, Conn., being given the order by Bishop Brewster. Since that time he has been in charge of All Saints church of Portland.

Mr. Bartlett is from South Manchester, Conn. He holds a degree of A. B. from Trinity college and B. D. from the theological school at Cambridge. He was given the order by Bishop Brewster at Middletown last June and since that time has been in charge of St. Luke's mission at Grants Pass.
