

Los Angeles, Dec. 21.—A burglar last night fought a revolver duel with Deputy Sheriff C. E. Potts, who surprised the burglar in the act of breaking into the home of Nicholas Harris. Potts was going to his own home, next door to that of Harris, last night when he saw the burglar on his neighbor's

### EMMA GOLDMAN TALKS FREE LOVE

Emma Goldman delivered the first lecture of a series in Portland, last night at Alisky hall. Instead of waving the red flag and upholding the use of bomb, dagger and poison as a panacea for all the ills which vex mankind, Miss Goldman this time confined herself to the rather trite statement that marriage is a failure. She preached the doctrine of free love, or free union, declaring that there is no such thing as happiness after marriage. Emma Goldman still wears the "Miss" before her name. She asserted that marriage is simply a woman's insurance, giving her a house to live in, and food and clothing, but no

home. When a woman marries her independence vanishes.

Tonight at Merrill's hall Miss Goldman will debate with Walter Thomas Mills on "Anarchism Versus Socialism." She has also expressed herself as willing to accept the challenge of John B. Barnhill for a debate, provided it can be arranged in time. She expects soon to sail for Australia.

Tomorrow afternoon at Alisky hall "The Devil Exonerated" will be the anarchist's subject, and tomorrow night she will lecture on the "Psychology of Violence," the lecture which her followers proudly state will eventually hang Miss Goldman.

New Postage Rate Goes Into Effect  
Official notice of the two cent postage rate between the United States and Germany, which goes into effect Jan-

uary 7, was received by Postmaster Minto this morning. All mail which goes at this new rate, two cents an ounce, will be dispatched from New York on German boats going direct. Heretofore much of the mail for Germany has gone by way of England or France, but under the new agreement this route will be eliminated on all mail at the two cent rate.

This new order does not apply to either Hawaii, Porto Rico or the Philippines. A letter may be sent from Alaska to Germany for two cents, however.

Australian dairy interests will save about \$20,000 a year hereafter by the adoption of a new form of strawboard box instead of wooden ones, in which to ship products to England.
