ALL THE TRAINS THROUGH VANCOUVER

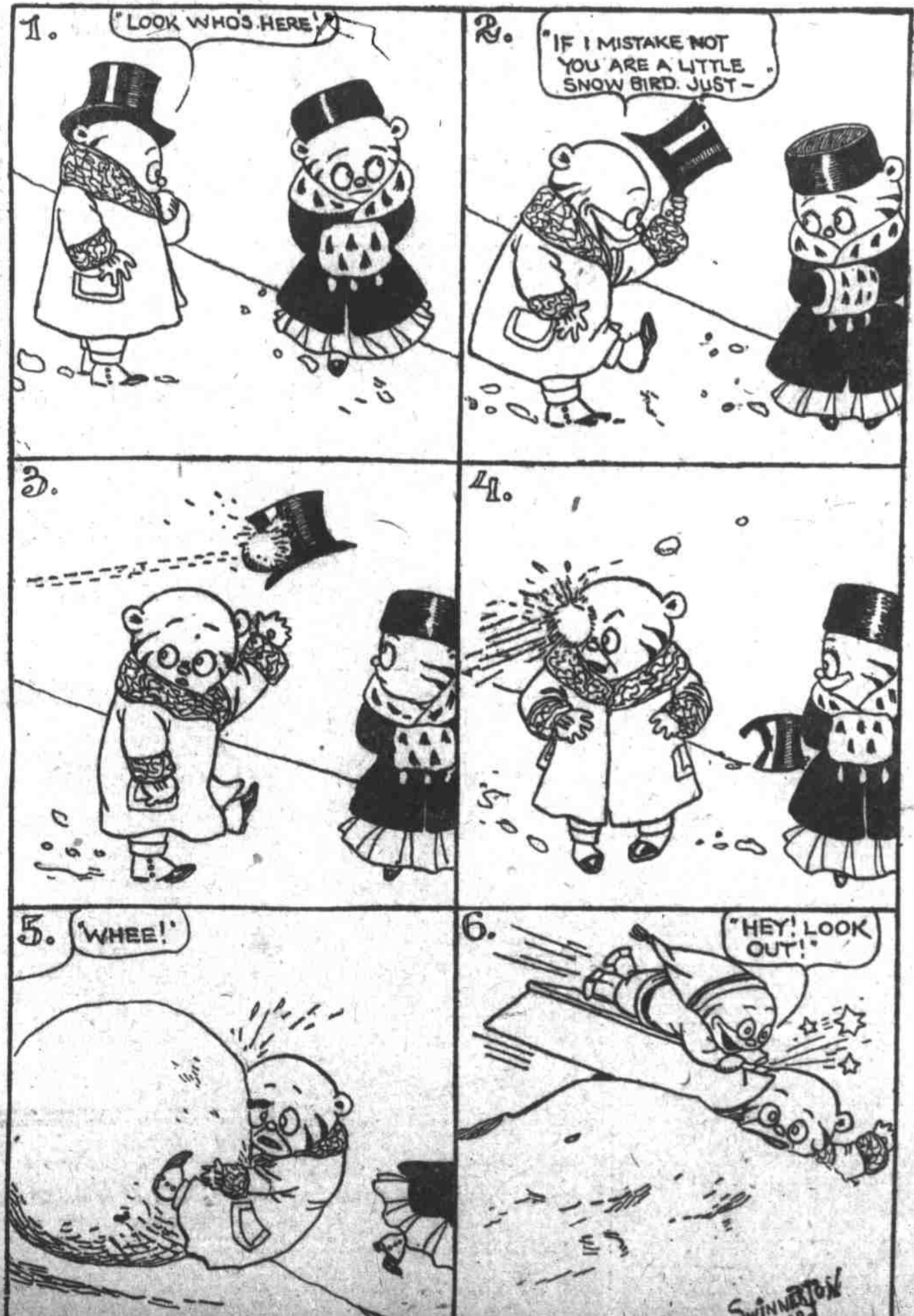
