

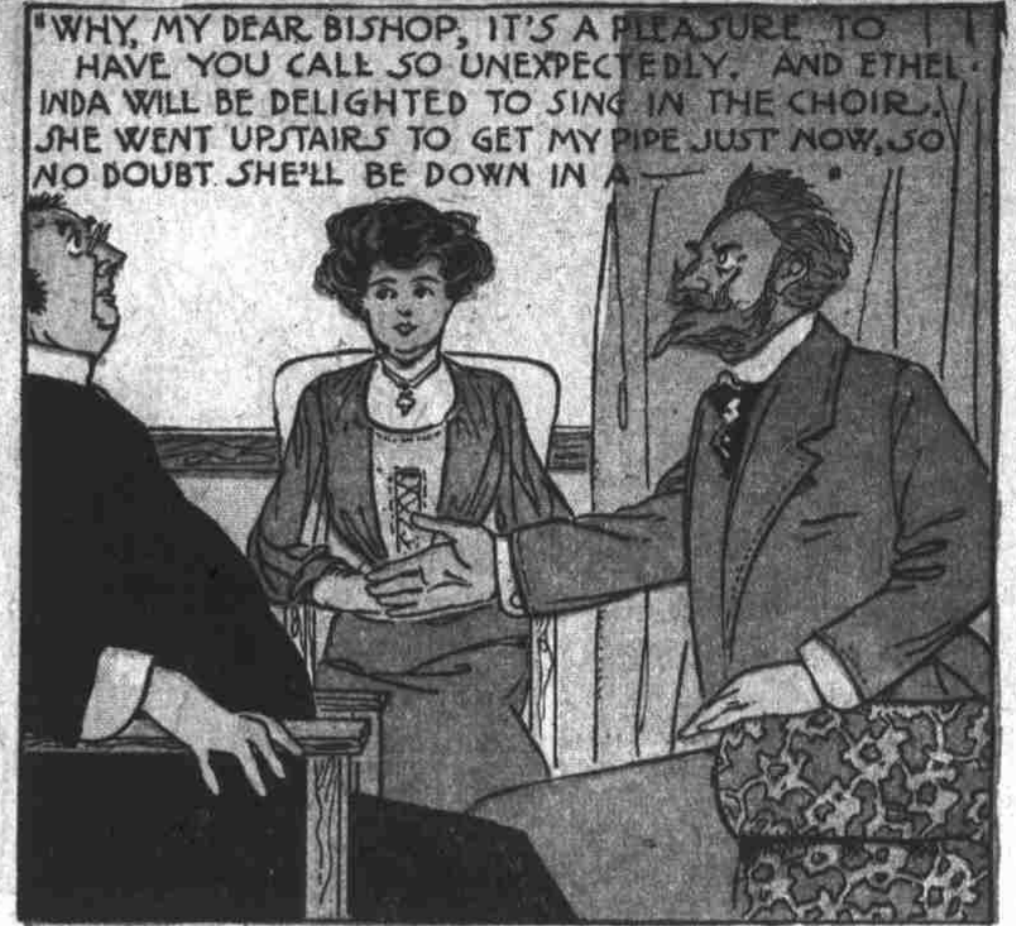
IT'S ONLY ETHELINDA--WITH FATHER'S TROUSERS ON

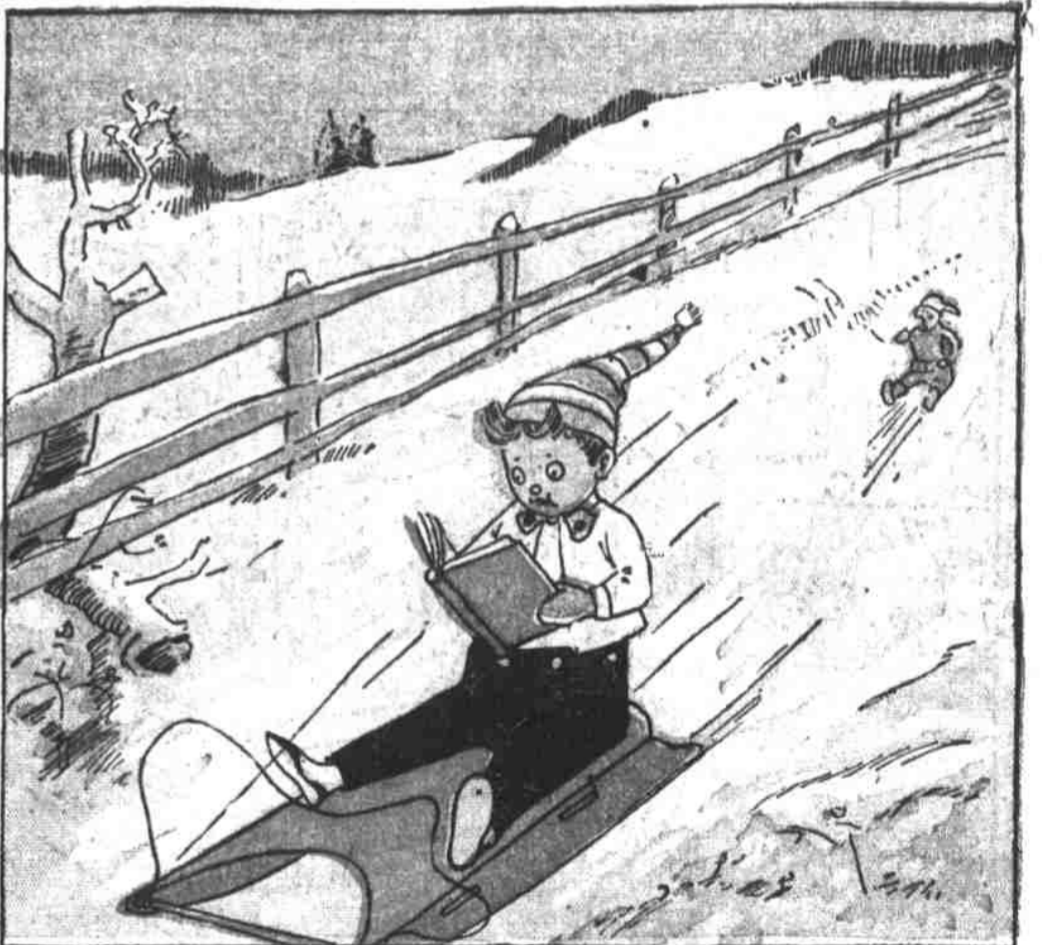
TED'S OBJECT SPELLING LESSON--S-L-E-D AND S-U-E



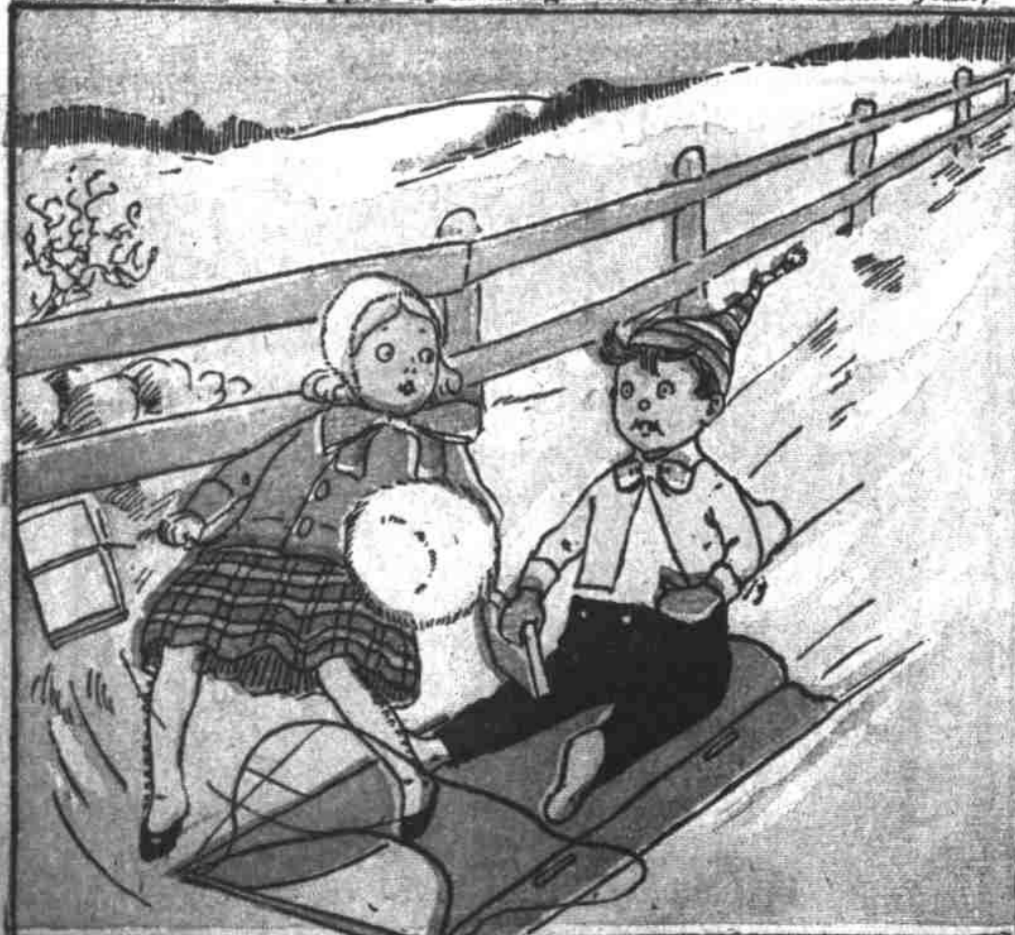
"S-L-E-D," said little Ted. "I must find what that spells." (Poor boy was so wrapped up in thought he heard not William's yells.)
