CHURCH SERVICES

Used Mails to Obtain Goods on Credit of Others Is Charge.

Meyer Well, arrested several days ago by the federal authorities at the request of the government agents at Albuquerque, New Mexico, on a charge of using the mails to defraud, has been released from custody on a bond of \$2000. Well will have a preliminary hearing before United States Commissioner Marsh January 15. He will probably engage legal counsel and fight the charge. Well asserts that a mistake has been made and that he is innocent.

According to the complaint filed against Well by United States District Attorney McCourt, Well's scheme was a most ingenious one. He would offer goods of different kinds from Chicago wholesale houses for houses of good standing. When the order was received at Albuquerque, or wherever it was being worked in the government, the goods were being shipped to the consignee, but the consignee refused to take the goods and in some cases refused to pay for them. Well would then call at the freight house, pay the charges, take the goods and dispose of them on his own account. In this way it is claimed he got possession of thousands of dollars worth of merchandise and the cost to him being the freight charges.

The postal authorities say that Well used the mails in carrying out his scheme and it is on this charge that he is being prosecuted. Well, it seems, left Albuquerque about 10 months ago. He was arrested by federal agents at San Francisco last spring but the officers were unable to locate him until they heard that he was in the city of Portland. It is claimed that Well got an inkling that his operations were under investigation and fled.
