BILLS TO BAR HONORABLE JAP

More Than One Member of California Legislature Preparing Bills.

WILL NATIONALIZE BANK

A. H. Hudson Takes Charge of Bend Institution. (Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Bend, Or., Dec. 29.—A. H. Hudson, a banker of Canyon City, Col., has arrived in Bend to take charge of the Bend bank. He will invest \$10,000 in the institution, and it will be nationalized, after which it will be known as the First National bank of Bend.
