

SNOW AND SLEET AT CAPITOL CITY

Icy Rails Partially Paralyze Salem's Streetcar Service.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Salem, Or., Jan. 6.—The Willamette valley is still in the grip of a severe storm. Though the wind has abated, the snow and sleet are falling and the mercury hovers around 30 degrees.

STORM TIES UP VESSELS AT THE ASTORIA DOCKS

BLINDNESS PUT HIM ON ROAD TO FORTUNE

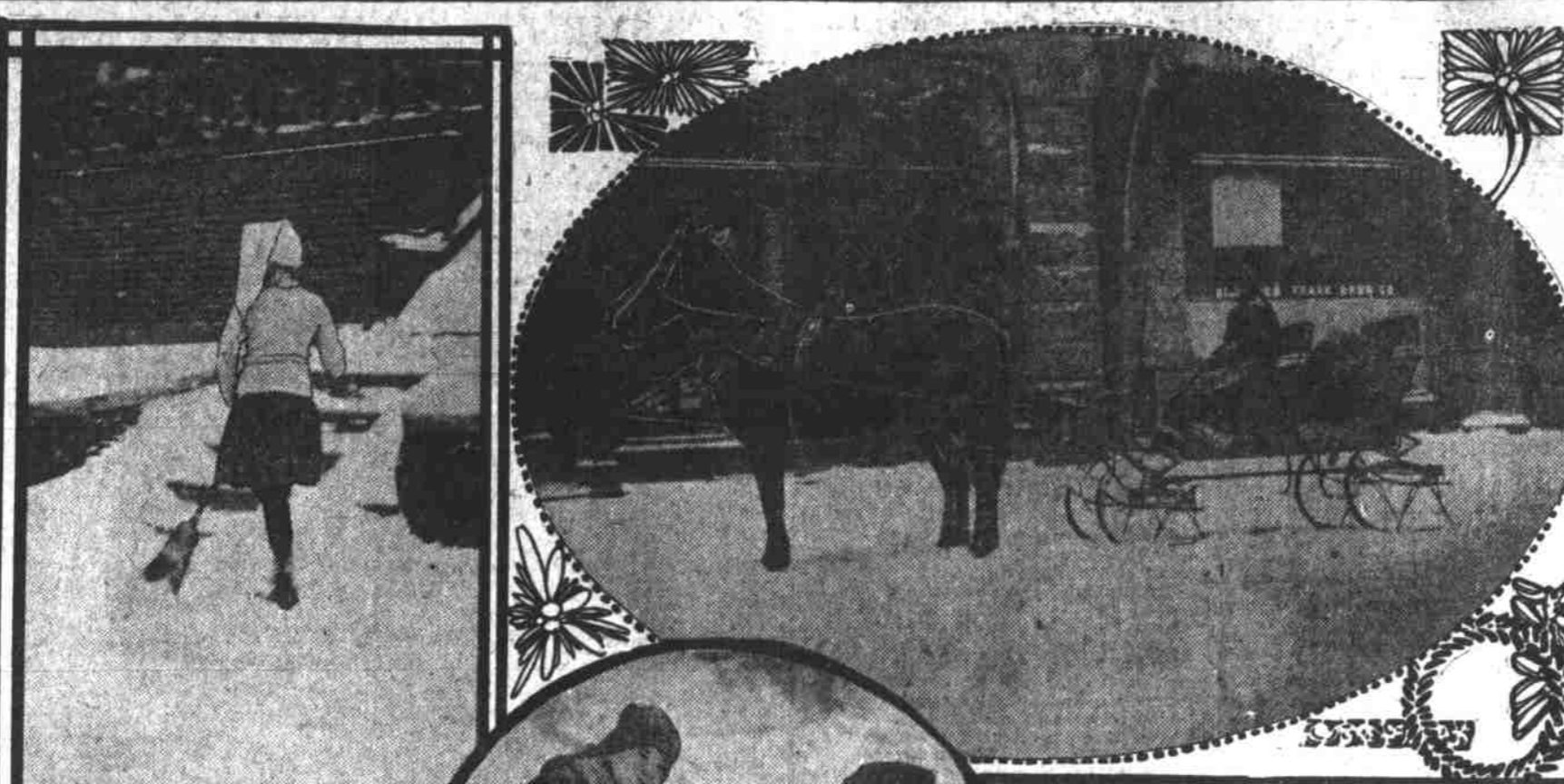
