TWO WANT THAT BRANCH ASYLUM

Pendleton and Baker City Cannot Agree on Division of Plums.

(By Journal Leased Salem Wire.)

Salem, Or., Jan. 19.—Who is going to get the eastern Oregon branch asylum, if the legislature should provide for such an institution? Baker county wants it; so does Umatilla county. Neither can agree to allow the other to have the plum. As a result, from the way it looks now, there will be two bills introduced, one providing for the location of the institution at Baker City and the other providing for its location at Pendleton. In all probability neither of the bills would be passed, for one would kill the other, because of the fight that would be made.

A conference was held between the delegation from Umatilla county and that from Baker yesterday at which the question was discussed. It was represented by the Umatilla county men that Baker City was fixed as the place for the establishment of the hospital court for the eastern Oregon district, as provided for in the Fulton bill now before congress.

Umatilla Proposes a Divvy.

The Umatilla county men suggested that it would be fair for Baker City to have that court, although Pendleton had wanted it, and in return Baker county should allow Umatilla to have the asylum; or, it was agreed, they could fix it up in reverse order. No agreement could be reached, however. An effort will be made to reach some agreement at a later meeting, but if that can not be done there will be two bills introduced. Big delegations from both Baker City and Umatilla county have been at Salem working for the settlement of the controversy to suit either side. The Baker City boosters will meet with those from Umatilla county and try to settle the question.

Union County with Umatilla.

Union county, which was in the fight, will probably go with Umatilla through the two bills. The Umatilla county now has 600 acres of land, bought some years ago for a branch asylum, which is being used as an agricultural experiment station. Senator Oliver has introduced a bill in the senate providing for the appropriation of \$15,000 for the maintenance of this station. This eliminates it from the asylum fight and because of the alignment puts it with Umatilla county, since Umatilla also wants an experiment station, at Hermiston.

ANOTHER CHARGE AGAINST WOMAN

JOINT COMMITTEE ON SALARY BILLS

Norton of Josephine Has Measure in the Interest of Equalization.

(By Journal Leased Salem Wire.)

Salem, Or., Jan. 19.—Senator Norton of Josephine county has a resolution to be introduced as soon as the senatorial situation is cleared away that aims to secure an equalization of the salaries of county officials in Oregon. Numerous bills making changes in salaries of county officers have been introduced and many more are expected. Usually this is left to the discretion of members representing the counties affected, but this method results in great inequality. In one county the sheriff receives \$1500, for instance, while in an adjoining county with no greater population or wealth, the sheriff gets double the amount.

Mr. Norton proposes to establish a joint committee of senate and house, two members from the former body and three from the latter, to which all bills relating to county salaries shall be referred. This committee is directed to agree on a uniform system, based on population or taxable wealth, adjusting and equalizing the salaries, in accordance with general rules.

It is known that Norton's resolution will receive strong support. Aside from the general considerations of policy, some of the members are frequently embarrassed by conflicting demands from their constituents for a salary too low to be relieved of the responsibility.
