**DELAY COMPLICATES GARBAGE PROBLEM, SAYS COUNCILMAN**

"I have been on two council committees appointed to select a site for a garbage crematory," said Councilman Wallace yesterday in reply to a request for an interview as to his attitude on the crematory question, "and neither committee was able to choose a location that would meet with the approval of the people.

"On the failure of the second committee to agree upon a site I made an individual report to the council in which I recommended the construction of an incinerating plant for each side of the river. Personally I am of the opinion that the site approved by the health board at the end of Sullivan's gulch is the place for the east side crematory.

"We should have taken the bull by the horns, two years ago when we had enough money in the general fund for the purpose and built a garbage burner on Sullivan's gulch. Property owners will kick no matter where you locate a plant for the destruction of refuse, but we should have crushed all opposition and proceeded to build the incinerator at that time.

"Now that we have let the opportunity pass by, I do not wish to be quoted as to what method I think ought to be employed to finance the construction of a crematory. But we certainly do need some kind of a plant somewhere to relieve the situation."

**CUTS COUNTY JUDGE'S SALARY**

Brooks of Malheur Thinks Richardson Is Getting Too Much Money.

(By Journal Leased Salem Wire.)

Salem, Or., Jan. 26.—Representative Brooks of Malheur and Harney has introduced a bill reducing the salary of the county judge of Malheur county from \$1800 to \$1200 a year. B. C. Richardson, a Democrat, is county judge in Malheur, while Brooks, Harney county's sole representative in the house, is a Republican. Brooks says Judge Richardson, prior to the election, placed himself on record as in favor of the reduction and was elected largely because of this pledge. According to Brooks, Richardson's name heads a petition which he has with him, asking the legislature to make the reduction. At the same time Brooks says Richardson has lobbyists at Salem working to defeat the reduction bill. The legislature increased the salary of the county judge in Malheur from \$1200 to \$1800.

The bill also increases the salary of the deputy sheriff of Malheur from \$1000 to \$1500. Other salaries in Malheur county are as follows: Sheriff \$2500, county clerk \$1800; deputy clerk \$1200, treasurer \$1000, school superintendent \$1000, assessor \$1500, commissioners \$2 per day during the time they are actually engaged with their duties.
