WEATHER REPORT
A large low pressure area, overlying the north Pacific states and the barometer is relatively high over the Dakotas. No very high winds have occurred during the last 24 hours, but the rainfall has been moderately heavy in western Oregon and northern California and light and scattering in Washington. It is slightly warmer, in southeastern Washington, eastern Oregon and southern Idaho, and slightly cooler in western Oregon and western Washington.
The indications are for occasional rain Sunday in western Oregon and light and scattering in Washington and snow east of the Cascade mountains. The winds in the interior will continue brisk from the south and along the coast they will gradually subside.
