PRIMARY LAW'S GOES DEFEATED

House Disposes of Mariner's Measure by the Vote of 17 to 12.

(By Journal Leased Salem Wire.)
Salem, Or., Feb. 18.—The incongruous form of the political convention system proposed by Representative Mariner in house bill 344 will not be attached to the direct primary law. Friends of the primary law, an emphatic victory, turning the bill down in the senate by a vote of 17 to 12. Senator Albee, chairman of the elections committee, opened the debate, saying merely it was an attempt to corrupt the primary system and defeat the objects of the primary law. Abraham opposed the bill on the ground that it would bring new complications and further disrupt the Republican party. He said whoever got a nomination in a convention would be at a disadvantage, as he would be charged with being a factional choice. Hart turned loose the machine war dogs. He said he thought the bill "ate up the right direction." He thought a convention would get good men before the people and argued that a convention could pick men of better qualifications than the primaries. The bill would not make the convention choice binding, but merely permit three men to be put before the people.

Left Fat; Back Slender

Municipal Bonds PAY NO TRIBUTE

Salem, Or., Feb. 18.—All bonds issued by cities, towns, or any municipality are to be exempt from taxation, according to a precedent established in the bill provided that all bonds hereafter issued are to be exempt from taxation. The purpose of the bill is to increase the value of municipal bonds by removing the tax charge made against them. It was argued that no bonds issued in the past should be exempt, as this would increase the value of securities that had been bought under the taxation system. If the governor approves the bill it will become a law.

HIGH HEeled SHOES AT WEARER'S RISK

(United Press Leased Wire.)
New York, Feb. 18.—High heels adorn women's shoes at the wearer's risk, according to a precedent established in the case of Newark, N. J. Two women appealed to the court for damages, charging they had been thrown to the ground by the sudden starting of a streetcar which started before they had cleared it on leaving it. Employees of the streetcar company testified that the plaintiffs were wearing high heeled shoes at the time of the accident, and the court dismissed the suits, holding that such shoes constituted contributory negligence.

FIVE WARRANTS FOR ALLEGED BUNCO MAN

Los Angeles, Feb. 18.—Five warrants for Lyman E. Jones, head of the Jones & Ryder Land company, are in the hands of officers, but no trace of the missing man has been found. Jones is accused of defrauding clients out of various sums of money. He secured \$2000 on the representation that he held a mortgage on certain property. E. S. Todd, the complaining witness, declared today that he afterward discovered Jones had no interest of any kind in the land.

DIX TO ISLANDS WITH SUPPLIES

Seattle, Feb. 18.—With her spacious hold filled with hay and feed and with 24 horses and mules aboard, the transport Dix departed early this morning for the Philippine Islands. The Dix arrived from the Orient January 18 and since has been taking on supplies for the United States army in the Philippines.

MISSING LEE FROK FOUND

Star Witness in Chinese Murder Case Will Not Explain Absence.
Police officers worked all last night trying to find Lee Frok, the star witness in the Lee Tai Hoy murder case, who disappeared last night for several hours. He was found at 5 o'clock this morning safe and sound, but he will give no explanation of his absence. From the explanation with which he handed out the cigars and smiled guiltily this morning when questioned by a detective, it is surmised that he had been playing fan-tan. Lee Frok's body guard landed in jail, however, because of his anxiety to find the missing Chinaman. Lee Sang inquired at the police station several times, about midnight, whether any shooting affair had been reported, and seemed so nervous that Detective Price finally questioned him. Lee denied having a revolver, but that one was hidden in his clothing, was revealed by a search. He was charged with carrying a concealed weapon. He told of Lee Frok's disappearance, and fearing that the hostility between the two factions of the Bow On Tong had again broken out, Price, accompanied by several Chinese, searched every part of both Chinatown districts until 1 o'clock this morning. Lee Frok appeared an hour later, having been missing six hours. It is rumored that a price of \$500 has been set upon the head of Lee Frok, among other members of the factions to which Lee Tai Hoy belonged. For the murder of a Chinese, two suspected gun men are now in the county jail awaiting trial. The murder of Lee Tai Hoy was also the result of this long war.

It is at present in crowded quarters at Fourth and Market, occupying the entire block, but larger quarters are under way near Oswego where the college department will be situated. ALASKA FOREST IS WITHDRAWN

President Creates 8,640,000 Acre Reserve in the Tongass District.
Eight million acres more of timber land have just been brought under the jurisdiction of the forest service, according to a telegram received at the Pacific northwest headquarters of the service. The timber lands affected by this order are in what is known as the Tongass district in Alaska, which comprises nearly all of southeastern Alaska. The dispatch says President Roosevelt signed the proclamation creating the new reserve February 16, and that 8,640,000 acres are comprised in the tract. This action of the president will be a great help to lumbermen in Alaska, who have for a number of years been handicapped in securing lands owing to the peculiar laws governing the territory of Alaska. Now all dealings will be with the United States government.
