

PLANTING OF ROSES DAY'S FEATURE

Civic Societies of City Will Aid in Making Anniversary Memorable—Social and Patriotic Meetings in Honor of Day.

Washington's birthday is to be observed in this city with holiday spirit and general exercises, the leading feature of which is to be the planting of the Luther Burbank rose, which he has called "Rose of Oregon," at the grounds of the Forestry building.

Other social and patriotic meetings will be held in the city. The new lodge building of Orient Lodge, I. O. O. F., is to be dedicated; the Knights of Columbus hold a special social evening and program, and the patriotic societies of the Sons and the Daughters of the American Revolution are to hold an elaborate banquet.

At Columbia Park. The principal features of public interest are the exercises to be held under the auspices of the Peninsula Rose society, W. J. Pease, president, in Columbia Park on the peninsula, at 10 o'clock. A special band of 75 musicians will give a concert. Ralph Hoyt and W. Wynn Johnson as representatives of the Rose Festival association, Judge Munly and other prominent men will be present and will take part in the exercises.

The rose planting at the grounds of the Forestry building will begin at 2 p. m. Fifty little girls and a number of little boys will take part in the planting of the roses and will add a picturesque feature to the outdoor exercises.

F. V. Dunham, acting director general, and also Welford Beaton, chief of publicity of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition will be present as the official representatives of the exposition management to take part in the exercises.

At Forestry Building. The following program will be given: Music by Professor Brown's Rose City band; rose planting; devotion; prayer, Bishop Charles Scadding; presentation to Luther Burbank; new rose offering, Chairman Dr. Emmet Drake; official acceptance of Burbank offering, Mayor Harry Lane; address, "Cementing Friendly Relations Between the Twin Cities of the Northwest," F. V. Dunham, acting director general; Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition, presentation of Joaquin Miller souvenirs to the human rosettes assisting in the rose planting, President Ralph W. Hoyt; benediction, Bishop Scadding.

The souvenirs to be given to the little children who assist in the rose planting are autograph cards with pictures of Joaquin Miller's home and surroundings.

The honor of holding the Rose of Oregon for the planting is to be enjoyed by little Louise Hoyt, daughter of President Hoyt of the Rose Festival association, a pleasing and pretty favor which the little lady can look back upon with much satisfaction.

At the same hour as the rose planting exercises the annual business meeting and election of officers of the Oregon society Sons of the American Revolution will be held at the assembly room of the Commercial club.

Sons of American Revolution. During the afternoon the Daughters of the American Revolution for chapter, will be entertained at the Portland Heights club by Mrs. John A. Keating. The officers and directors of the society are to assist in receiving and the young girls of the organization will assist the hostess in serving her guests. The patriotic address of the day will be given by ex-Senator Huston.

In the evening Washington's birthday will be observed by the gathering of members of the Daughters of the American Revolution and the Sons of the American Revolution at a banquet at the Hotel Portland. BUILD PACKING HOUSE

White Salmon Valley Ranch Will Be Independent.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Husum, Wash., Feb. 20.—J. R. and P. B. McCracken have the material on the ground for the erection of a large modern fruit packing house. Their ranch lies along the White Salmon river, two miles above Husum, 70 acres of which comprise one of the finest young growing orchards in the valley. The McCrackens shipped nearly 5,000 boxes of choice apples last season, of which the Newtown and Spitzenberg varieties predominated. They expect to market fully double this number of boxes during the present year.

RICH GOLD FIND

Merlin Citizen Discovers Pocket on Pickett Creek.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Merlin, Or., Feb. 20.—Bradbury last Monday created excitement by exhibiting 30 ounces of gold nuggets, which he had taken out of a pocket on Pickett creek, six miles west of Merlin. On Friday Mr. Bradbury came in again with 13 ounces more. Mr. Bradbury has for several years devoted his entire time hunting pockets. He has sent for his son to come and assist him in taking out the remainder of the gold which he feels certain is still in the ground. The vein is clearly traceable for over 300 feet on the surface and gives evidence of being of gigantic proportions. This district has long been famous for the rich pockets that have been found in its hills, but this is the largest one that has been opened up for many years. The average yield, so far, has been about \$100 per foot on the shaft, and working alone Mr. Bradbury has taken out over \$200 per day with shovel and pan. It is safe to say that the present excitement will be the means of opening up other pockets that will be equally as rich.

PORTLAND MAN GOES TO JAIL

J. S. Corcoran, Bigamist, Says Wife No. 2 Did Not Know of Wife No. 1.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Spokane, Wash., Feb. 20.—J. S. Corcoran, formerly an optician of Portland, pleaded guilty this afternoon to the charge of bigamy brought by his first wife and was sentenced to from six months to five years in the penitentiary by Judge Hinkley. He will start with a bunch of prisoners for Walla Walla tomorrow. Corcoran arrived in Spokane this morning and immediately acknowledged his guilt. He asked for a speedy trial, with the result that it was begun the first thing this afternoon. The bigamist declared Lela Marshall knew he had a wife when she married him here January 28. Lela Marshall, wife No. 2, is to be tried in a few days. It is believed she will be dismissed. She is still under \$500 bonds.
