"Why, there it is, Ted; it's parade. Oh, my, just see the men! They're coming up this way. I guess we'll see them better then."



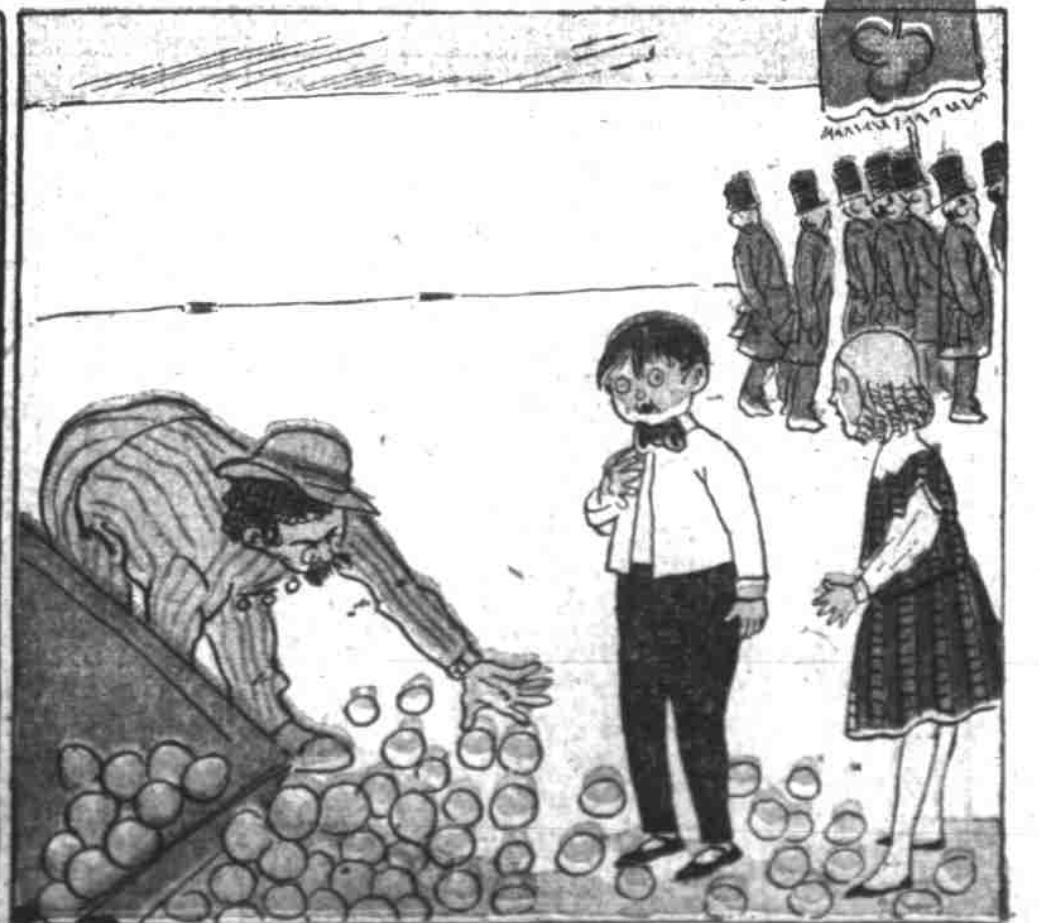
"Oh, yes, of course, and I know why; this is St. Patrick's Day. What is O-R-A-N-G-E? I wish the band would play."
