

CRACKS BRIGHT FOR NORMAL SCHOOLS

Pending Probe of State Officials' Conduct Is Taken as Joke.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Olympia, Wash., March 13.—The first state investigation to be held in the state of Washington will begin within ten days the state capitol and it promises to be of the most sensational character. The committee consisting of Senators Elshoff and Allen, and Representatives McMaisters, Taylor and Hubble, has announced that the investigation will be held next. At any rate the beginning will not be later than Tuesday.

The investigation will be held in Olympia the other day. The committee will have sufficient expenses allowed to cover a full and free investigation of any matter that may come to the attention of the members or any citizen. The attorney general has been instructed by the legislature to act on behalf of the state and will prepare the case as quickly as possible.

Probes Have Been Made. Two years ago an investigation of the state railway commission, or of the state of Olympia, was ordered, with the result that the accused member resigned and paid to the state in salary wrongfully taken. With this exception the state has been free of investigations until the Root scandal came up last winter in the supreme court.

The amount of money rumored as involved in the investigation here is variously estimated at from \$35,000 to \$50,000. Up to the present time the insurance commissioner is the only one under direct fire, but in an address in the senate the other day Senator Polson referred to other irregularities which he asserted would be brought to the attention of the committee with the determination of the members to bring before the public. No mention was made of the amount of money involved, or of anything that would be brought into the limelight.

Public Will Be Admitted. In Olympia the investigation is taken as a joke. In the senate the fight to limit the amount of money to be expended. Political circles here are taking the idea of irregularities, even in the case of J. H. Shively, the insurance commissioner, as a matter of course. No mention was made of the amount of money involved, or of anything that would be brought into the limelight.
