

REGENTS SILENT ON TIGHT CASE

It is believed the taking of evidence will consume several days. The regents refuse to discuss the case.

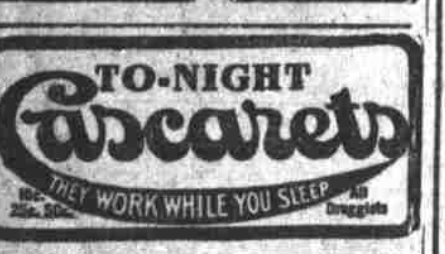
