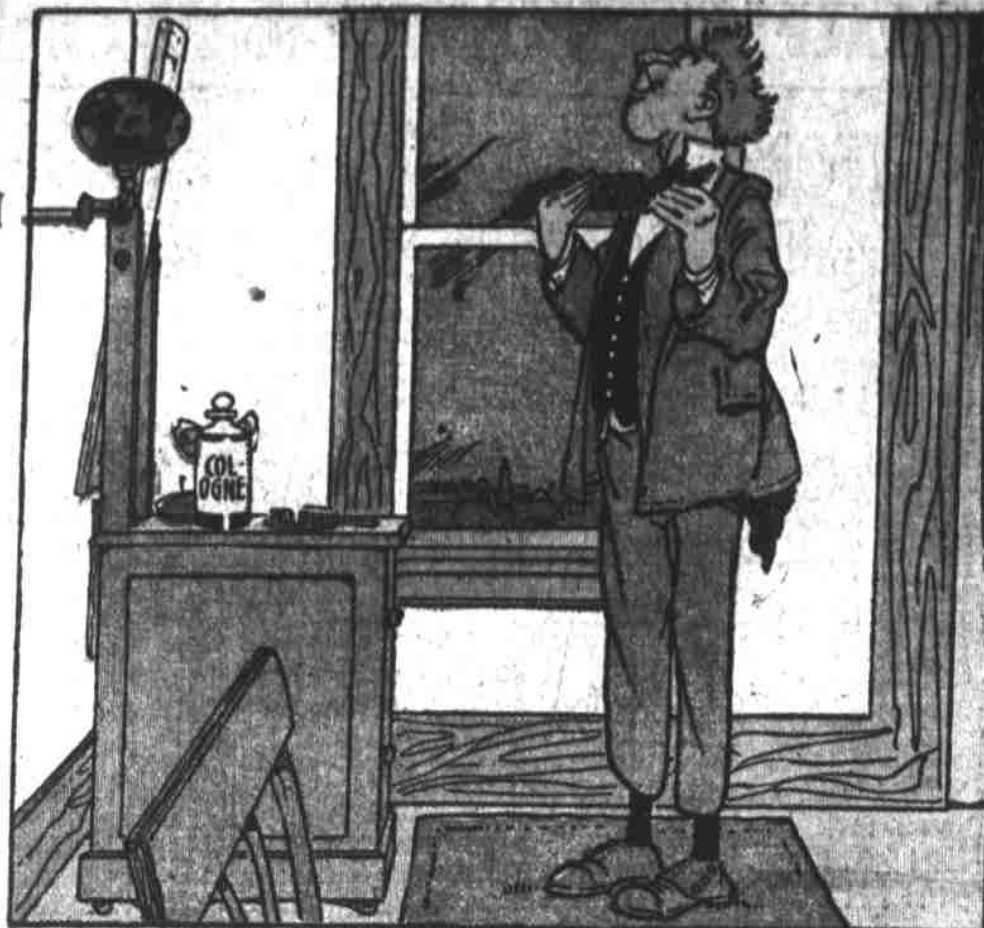
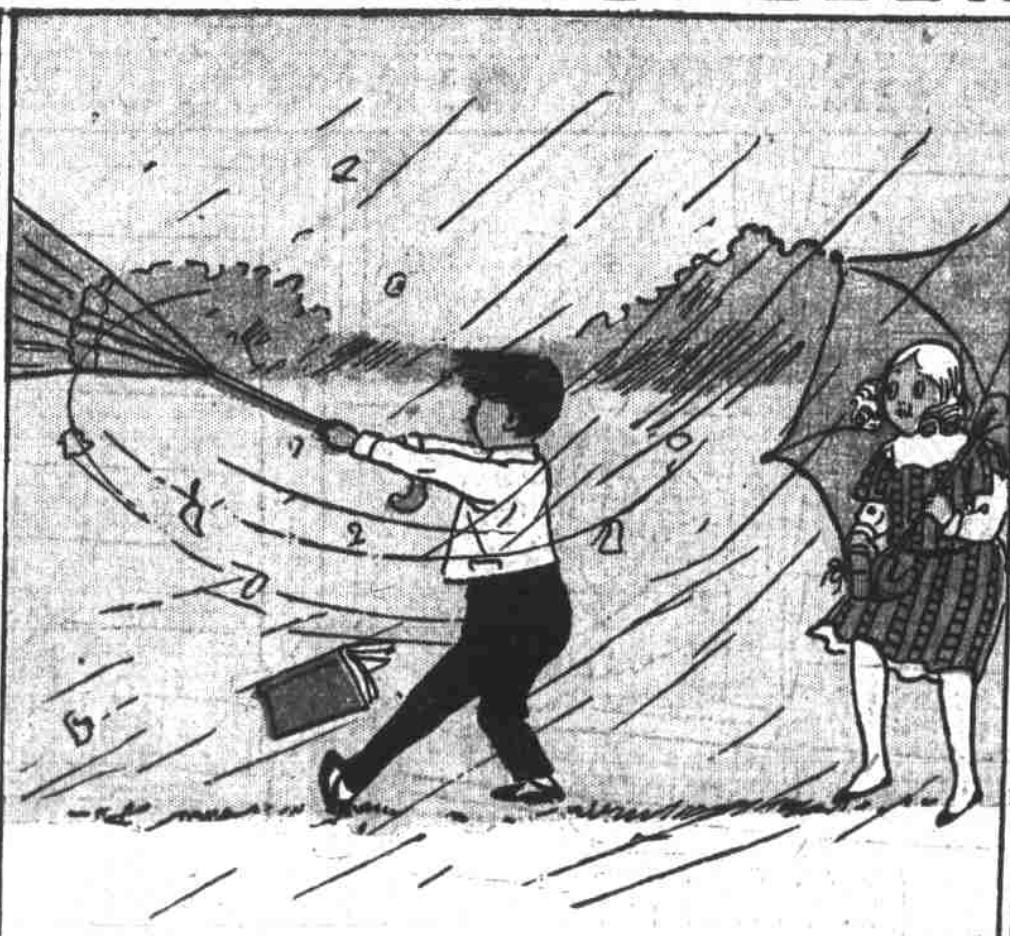


IT'S ONLY ETHELINDA—SHE WORKS A GOLD-BRICK GAME
