THE COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS AND PLATFORM, APPOINTED AT THE OPENING OF THE BAKER THEATRE REPUBLICAN CONVENTION THIS MORNING, MADE THE FOLLOWING REPORT AT THE AFTERNOON SESSION, WHICH REPORT WAS ADOPTED.

Whereas, The preamble of the direct primary nominating law recites that under our form of government, political parties are useful and necessary, at the present time, and also that the purpose of this law is better to secure and to preserve the rights of political parties and to insure political organization, and of their members and candidates.

Whereas, in order to promote harmony within the party, and insure to the candidates selected by the party at the primaries, the united, cordial and sincere support of all the voters in the coming election, organization and cooperation are essential.

Second of the Party.

Be it further resolved, that the record of the Republican party throughout the years since its organization in 1866, in promulgating and crystallizing in its legislation a far-reaching and five policies principles of government best adapted to the needs of the American people, whereby the general welfare has been advanced, and the country and orderly administration of the law has been so successfully secured.
